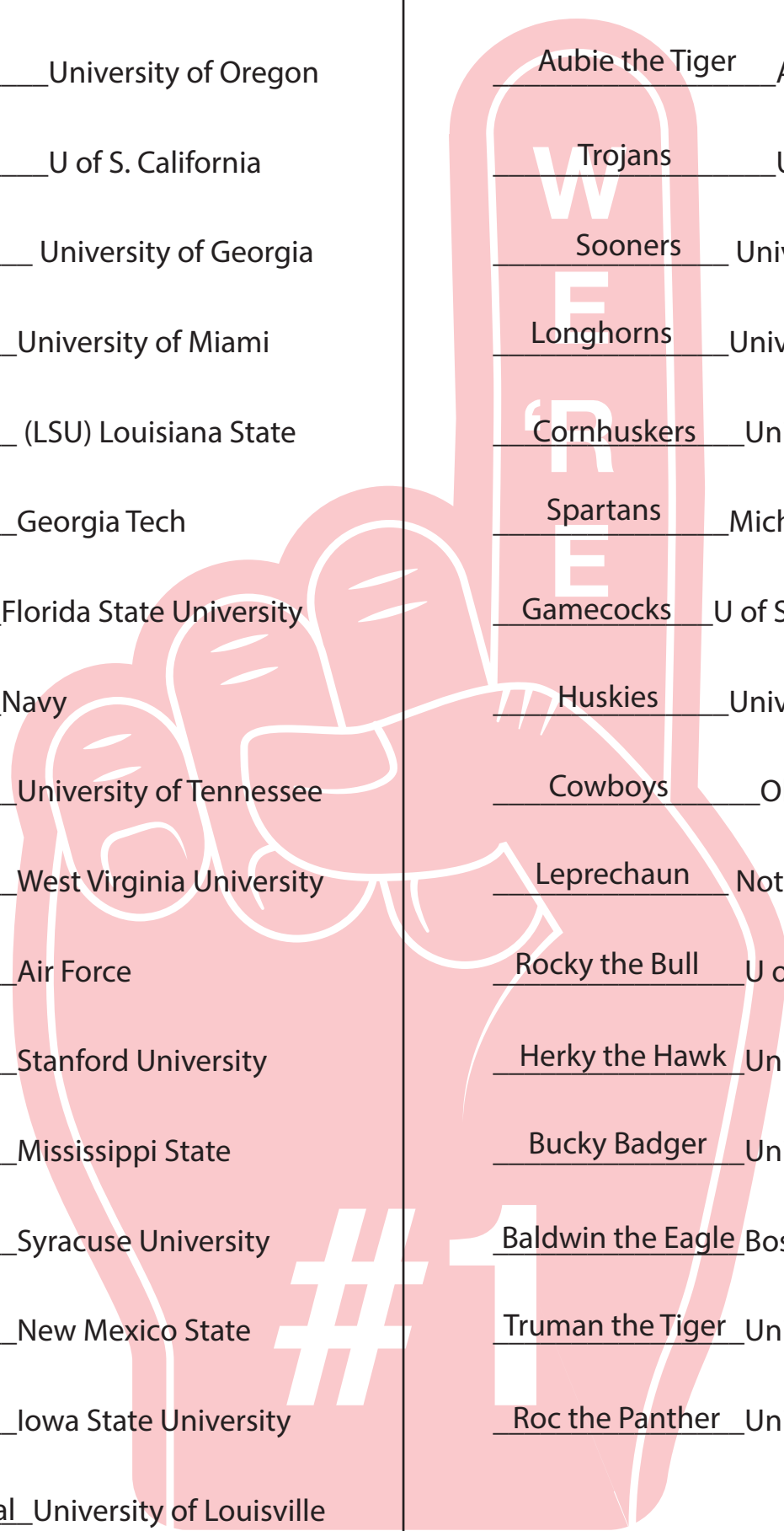

OLDEST COLLEGES IN AMERICA

_____ University of Pennsylvania

The University of Pennsylvania (commonly referred to as Penn) was founded by Benjamin Franklin and was the first US university to offer both undergraduate and postgraduate studies.

_____ The College of William and Mary

Named for the British co-monarchs who were reigning at the time and who gave the university its royal charter (the first for any university in the US), the College of William and Mary was the first school of higher education in the US to install an honor code of conduct for students.

_____ Princeton University

Originally founded as the College of New Jersey by New Light Presbyterian in order to train ministers. Nassau Hall was technically the temporary capital of the US for four months in 1783, when the Continental Congress met there.

_____ Washington and Lee University

A private liberal arts university located in Lexington, VA its first major benefactor was George Washington. The Lee in the title came from General Robert E. Lee, who was president of the university from 1865 until his death in 1870.



OLDEST COLLEGES IN AMERICA CONTINUE

_____ University of Delaware

Originally founded as “free School” and has changed its name and location several times. Since Delaware was part of the Pennsylvania colony until 1776, the university was denied a charter in order to prevent a rivalry with the University of Pennsylvania.

_____ Yale

It was renamed Yale in recognition of a gift from Elihu Yale, a governor of the British East India Company. Also that year, Yale moved to its current location in New Haven. Yale was the first US university to award a PhD. It currently ranks fourth in the world for law studies, and sixth for arts and humanities.

_____ St. John’s College

A private liberal arts college which was originally founded as King William's School. It gained its current name in 1784 and now has two campuses, one in Annapolis, the state capital of Maryland, and another in New Mexico’s state capital, Santa Fe.

_____ Moravian College

A small college located in Bethlehem, PA. It was established by 16-year-old Countess Benigna von Zinzendorf, who established it as a Bethlehem Female Seminary, the first boarding school for young women in the US.

_____ Columbia University

Located in New York City and chartered as King’s College by royal charter of George II of Britain, and renamed Columbia College after the US gained independence. Five founding fathers are among the alumni.
