

- 4. B. 36, In 1903 he was tagged for 4 runs in the first inning. He lost the game 7-3.
- 5. B. Jimmy Sebring, This Pittsburgh player went down in history for his 7th inning shot.
- 6. B. Robert Clemente, Tony Gwynn- 3141, Rod Carew-3053, and Sam Rice finished just 13 hits shy of 3,000 with 2987. Clemente played with the Pirates.
- 7. C. Harmon Killebrew of the Twins had just 1559 career walks.
- 8. A. Ricky Henderson, Lou Brock was second with 938. Rickey had 1,406!
- 9. D. Cy Young was a career 511-316, both marks setting a record.
