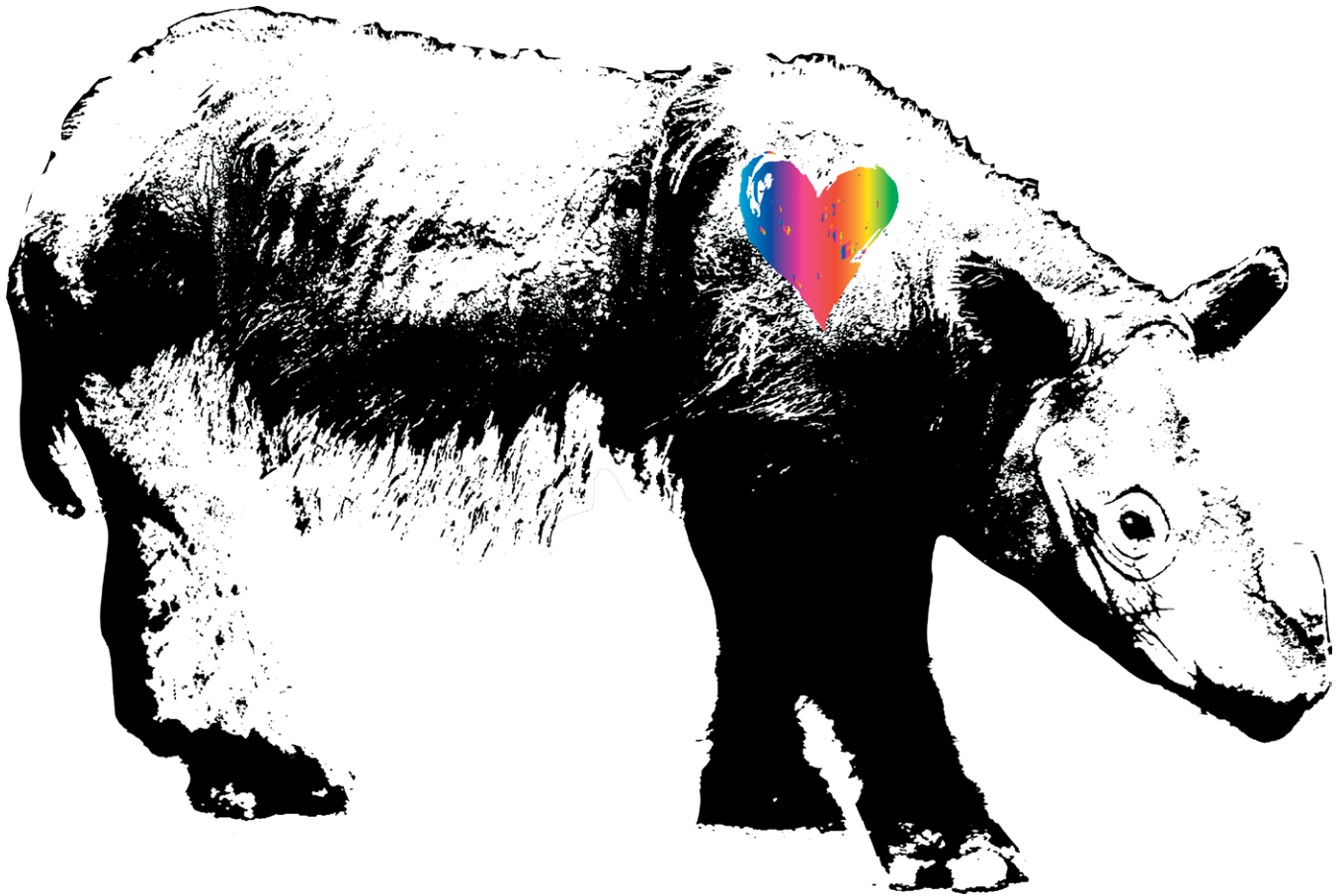

Just what is an endangered species? It is actually any type of organism that is threatened into extinction. One main reason an animal may become extinct is because of a loss of habitat. Habitats can be lost naturally or by human development.

The Endangered Species Act of 1973 is one of the most effective conservation laws in the United States. Using science-based management plans, it has prevented the extinction of 99% of the species it protects.

After a thorough review process, a species can be classified as either endangered or threatened.

Endangered means the species is in danger of extinction throughout all or a significant part of its range.

Threatened means the species is likely to become endangered in the foreseeable future.





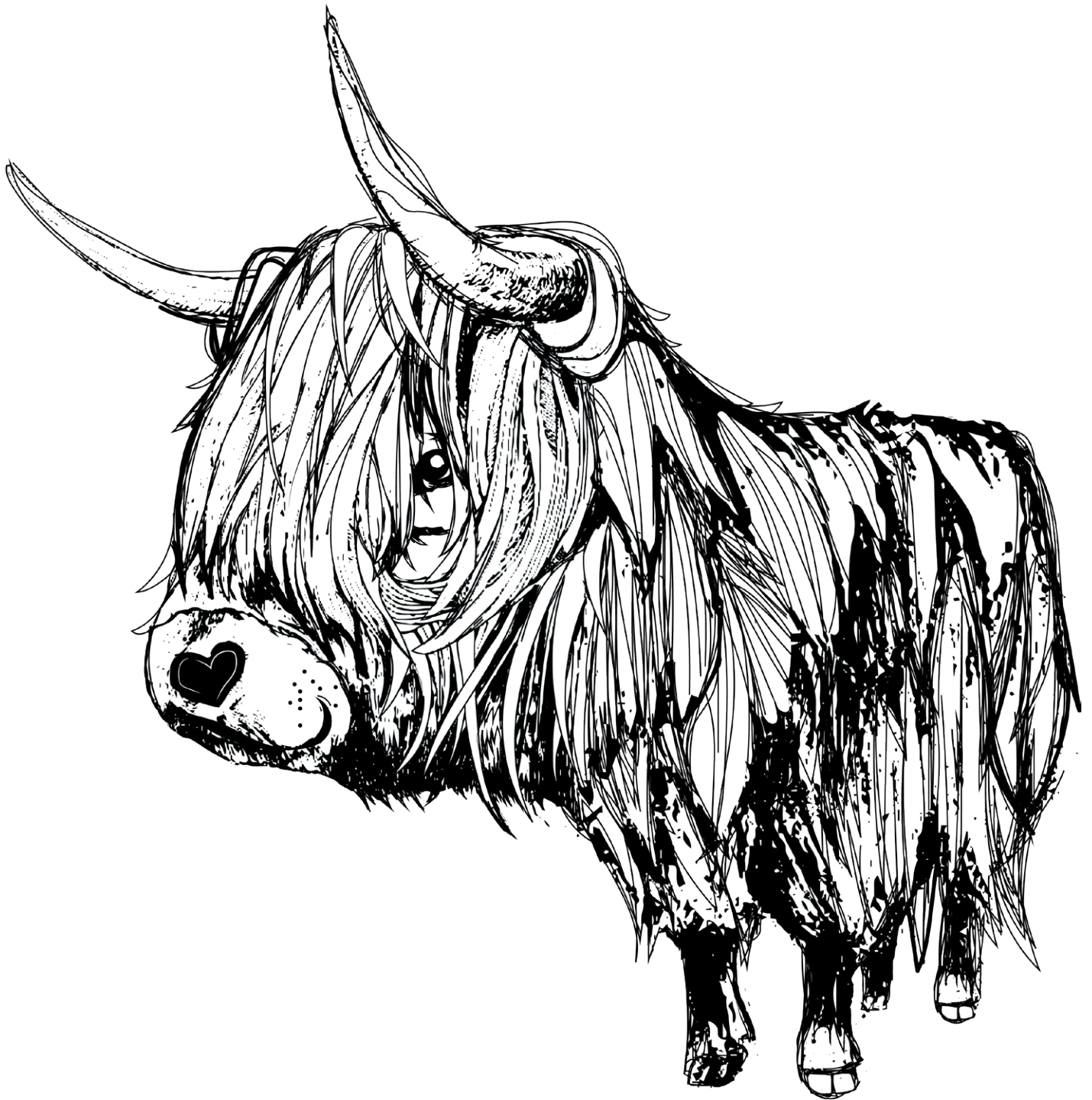
SUMATRAN ELEPHANT

Sumatran elephants feed on a variety of plants and deposit seeds wherever they go, contributing to a healthy forest ecosystem. They also share their lush forest habitat with several other endangered species, such as the Sumatran rhino, tiger, and orangutan, and countless other species that all benefit from an elephant population that thrives in a healthy habitat.



CARACAL

Pretty kitty. With their sleek, streamlined body, short, reddish gold coat, and dramatic markings on the face, caracals are among the most beautiful of wild cats.



HIGHLANDS COW

The ancient Highland cow is the perfect combination of adorable and low maintenance. The Highland is an ancient breed of cattle that originated in the Scottish Highlands and Western Isles of Scotland. First mentioned in the 6th century A.D., the breed is known for its long, thick hair and its hardiness in harsh conditions.



PANGOLIN

These solitary, primarily nocturnal animals, are easily recognized by their full armor of scales. A startled pangolin will cover its head with its front legs, exposing its scales to any potential predator. If touched or grabbed it will roll up completely into a ball, while the sharp scales on the tail can be used to lash out.
