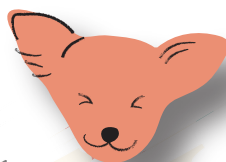
All Lassies are descendants of Pal.

His Master's Voice (HMV) was the name of a major British record label created in 1901 by The Gramophone Co. Ltd.

In the 1939 movie The Wizard of Oz, Toto was played by a female brindle Cairn Terrier named Terry. She was paid a \$125 salary each week, which was more than some of the human actors (the singers who played the Munchkins reportedly received \$50 to \$100 a week).
