Put together a sing-along, take turns sharing your favorite songs, or just fill your day with humming and song - singing has so many benefits that should be shared and enjoyed every day!

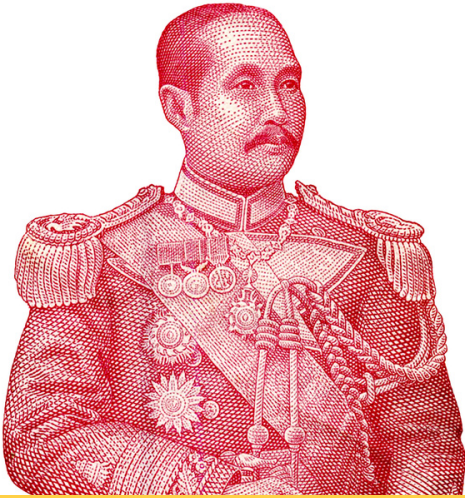


## Today in History



In 1935, Legendary American athlete Jesse Owens equaled or broke 4 world records in 45 minutes at the Big Ten meet at Ferry Field in Ann Arbor. He won 4 gold medals in the 1936 Olympic Games in Berlin & was the most successful athlete at the games.

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## **DID YOU KNOW?** **Chulalongkorn, King of Siam**

As the fifth king of Siam from 1868 to 1910, Chulalongkorn abolished slavery, established a modern army, and improved the judicial and financial institutions. He laid the foundation of modern Thai citizenship through primary education and saved his kingdom from Western colonialism. Chulalongkorn traveled, and his experiences shaped his ideas about modernization. He had numerous wives and fathered 77 children. He passed away at the age of 57.

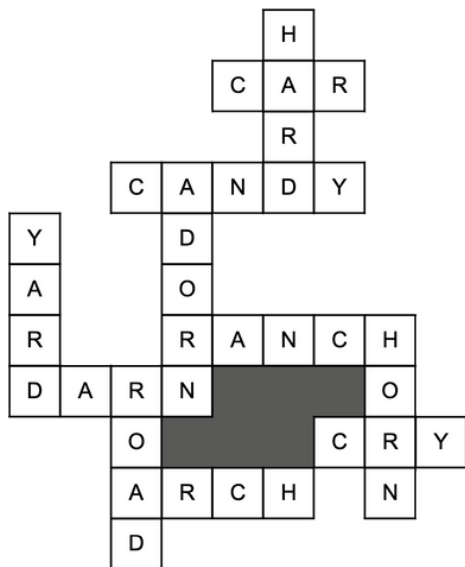
## Trivia Answer: D.
