In 1878, Thomas Edison's Phonograph was shown for the first time at the Grand Opera House. It was developed as a result of his work on two other inventions, the telegraph and the telephone. The Edison Concert Phonograph came later, in 1899.

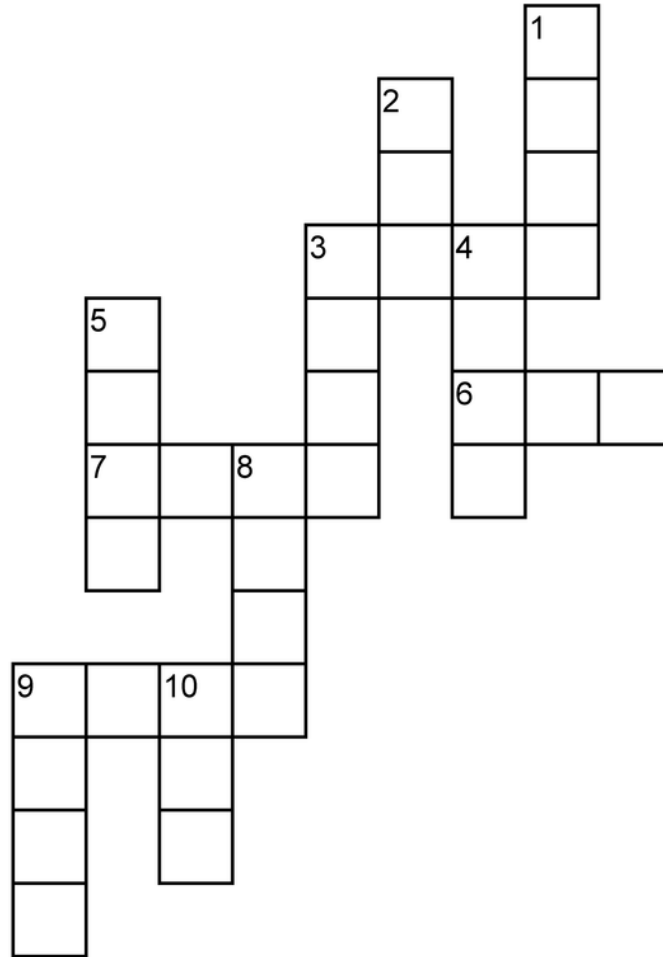

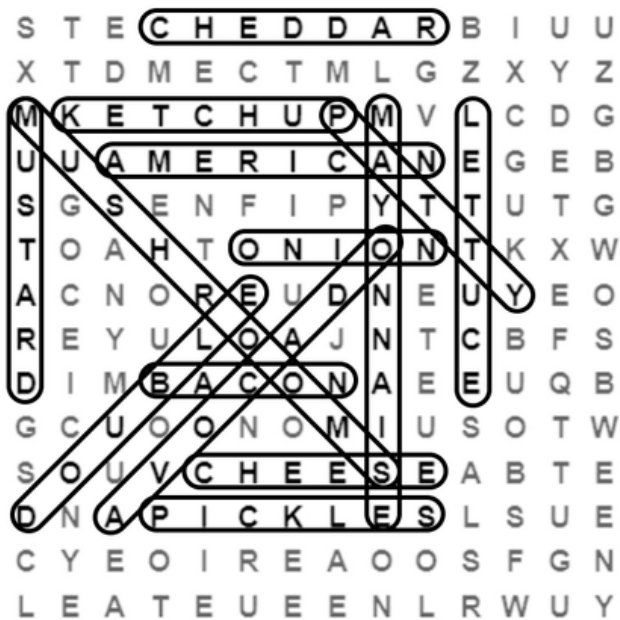

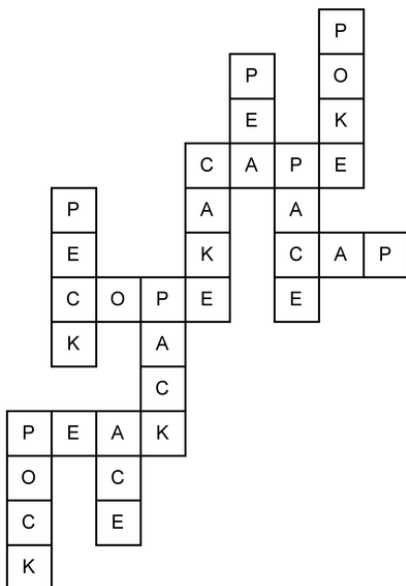
