Did you know that no two giraffes have the same spotted pattern? Their spots are as unique as human fingerprints! Let's celebrate the fantastic giraffe today!

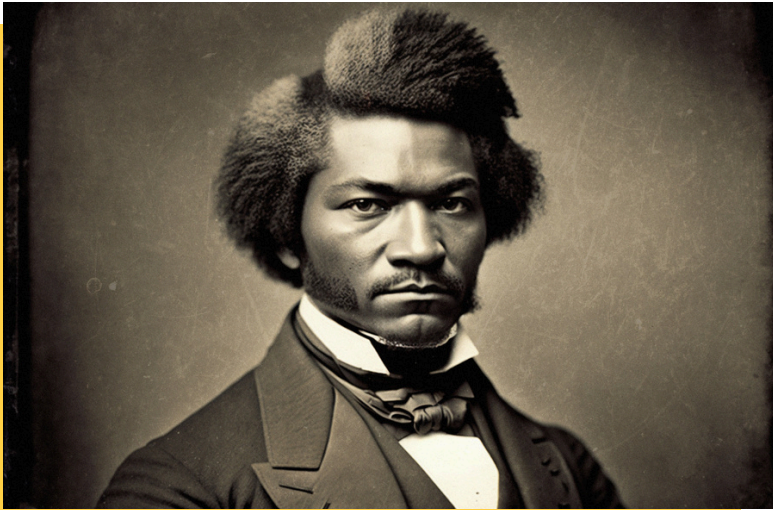


## Today in History

## DID YOU KNOW? A Chance Meeting

William Lloyd Garrison's newspaper, *The Liberator*, was the largest abolitionist publication of its time. Frederick Douglass, a reader of the newspaper, attended an anti-slavery convention in New Bedford, where he gave a speech on his life as a runaway slave. Garrison became Douglass's mentor, helping him become a lecturer at the Massachusetts Anti-Slavery Society. Their partnership helped Douglass ascend to national recognition, leading to his meeting with Lincoln in the White House.
