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#### DID YOU KNOW? A Penalty Never Paid

On November 5, 1872, Susan B. Anthony voted in a presidential election. At that time, women were not allowed to vote. Two weeks later, Anthony was arrested, and eventually fined \$100 for voting illegally. "I shall never pay a dollar of your unjust penalty," she said—and she never did. It was more than 40 years before the 19th Amendment granted women the right to vote in the United States.
