National Amelia Earhart Day

To honor one of America's pioneers in aviation on her birthday, Amelia Earhart Day celebrates Amelia's life and achievements. Her love of flying started in December of 1920, when she flew to California with World War II pilot Frank Hawks. Twelve years later, in 1932, she became the first woman to fly solo across the Atlantic Ocean.

The only other person to have made the same flight at that time was Charles Lindbergh. On June 1st, 1937, she began her famous flight around the world and was last seen with her navigator, Fred Noonan, on July 2nd. They only had 7,000 miles remaining on their journey. Amelia's disappearance is still a mystery today, and many theories have been presented. What do you think happened to her?

Another Face to Mt. Rushmore?

There have been several efforts to add a fifth face to Mt. Rushmore. Women's rights activist Rose Arnold Powell led an indefatigable crusade to get Susan B. Anthony's visage on the mountain. Meanwhile, conservatives spearheaded the "Reagan on Rushmore" or "Ron on the Rocks" movement to memorialize the 40th president's legacy. There have even been efforts to add Elvis Presley's slicked-back likeness to the Black Hills.

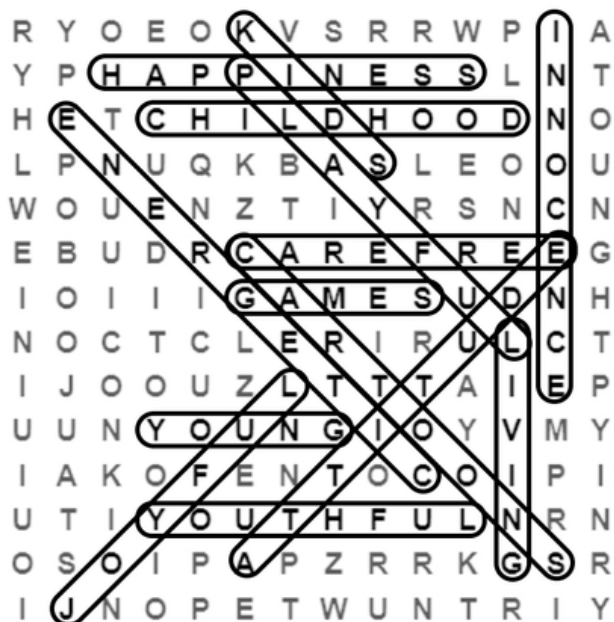


SOLUTIONS
