DID YOU KNOW? Worcestershire Sauce

It may be tough to say, but the savory condiment was created in Worcester, England in 1835, when a former governor of India, Lord Sandys was looking for sauces that reminded him of his favorite Asian flavors. John Lea and William Perrins came up with a fish and vegetable mixture that they stored in the cellar of their store and forgot about. Rediscovered two years later the sauce had fermented. The flavor became popular as a condiment. It was the first sauce exported to America in 1839.






Every answer uses only the letters in the word: **SANDWICH**





