Passed by a Joint Resolution of Congress on October 15, 1964, and proclaimed by President Lyndon B. Johnson, White Cane Safety Day is not a day to help people with white canes across the street, but instead to help people who are blind live and function independently.

The best way to help is by keeping aisles and doorways clear of boxes and other debris. If you know someone who is blind or visually impaired, celebrate with them today and maybe have them take you for a walk.




Today in History



In 1860, 11-year-old Grace Bedell wrote to Abraham Lincoln, urging him to grow a beard to improve his appearance. He responded to the letter on October 19th but made no promises. He grew a full beard within a month. Lincoln was elected a few weeks later as the 16th U.S. President.

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DID YOU KNOW? Burnsides' Sideburns

Sideburns, the strips of facial hair that grow down the side of the face, used to be known as side whiskers or side hair. One prominent side-whisker-wearer was Ambrose E. Burnside, a Civil War general whose distinctive facial hair connected in the middle via a mustache, with no beard beneath. This style of facial hair became known as the "Burnside." At some point, the fact that "side" was part of Burnside's name led to a mishmash of "Burnside" and "side whiskers" into "sideburns."




SOLUTIONS
