

DID YOU KNOW? Snakes See with Heat Vision

Some snakes, like pit vipers, boas, and pythons, can detect infrared waves from warm objects through special heat-sensing pits located between their eyes and nostrils or along their lips. These pits take in the infrared radiation and send signals to the brain, which then passes the information to the eyes, producing a thermal image. This ability allows snakes to accurately locate prey in complete darkness, helping them hunt at any time of day.

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


