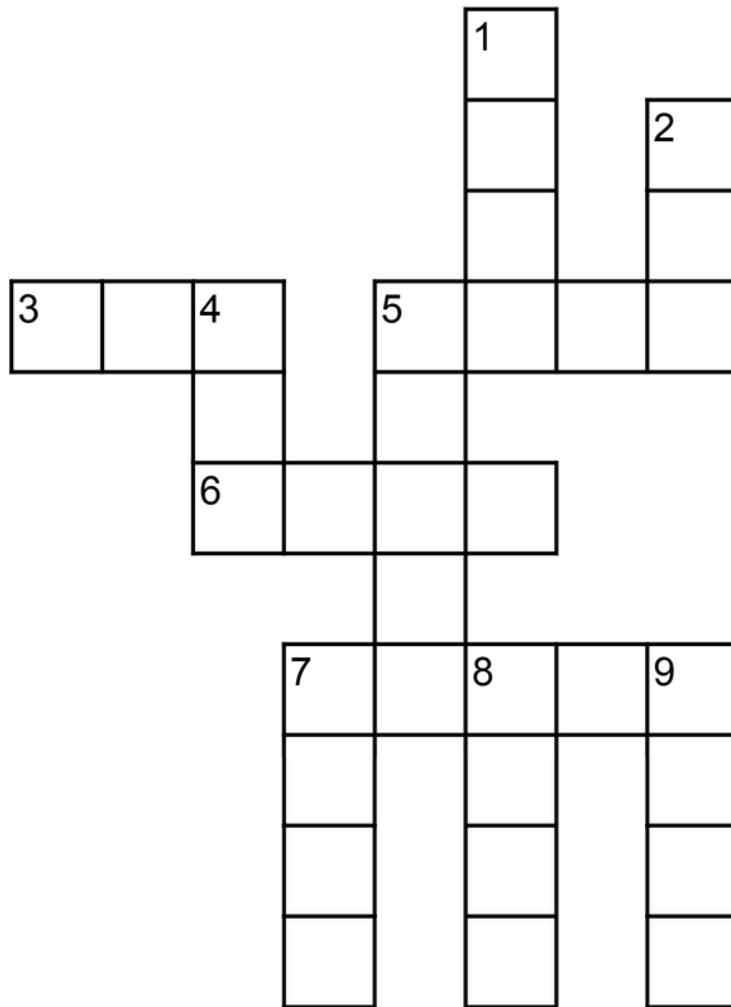

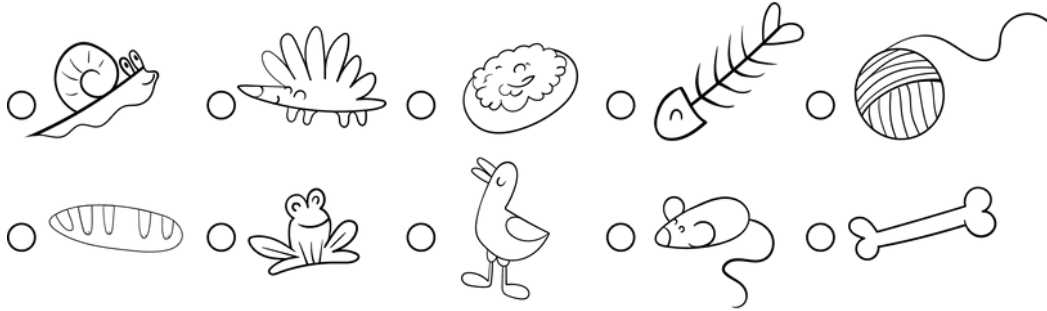

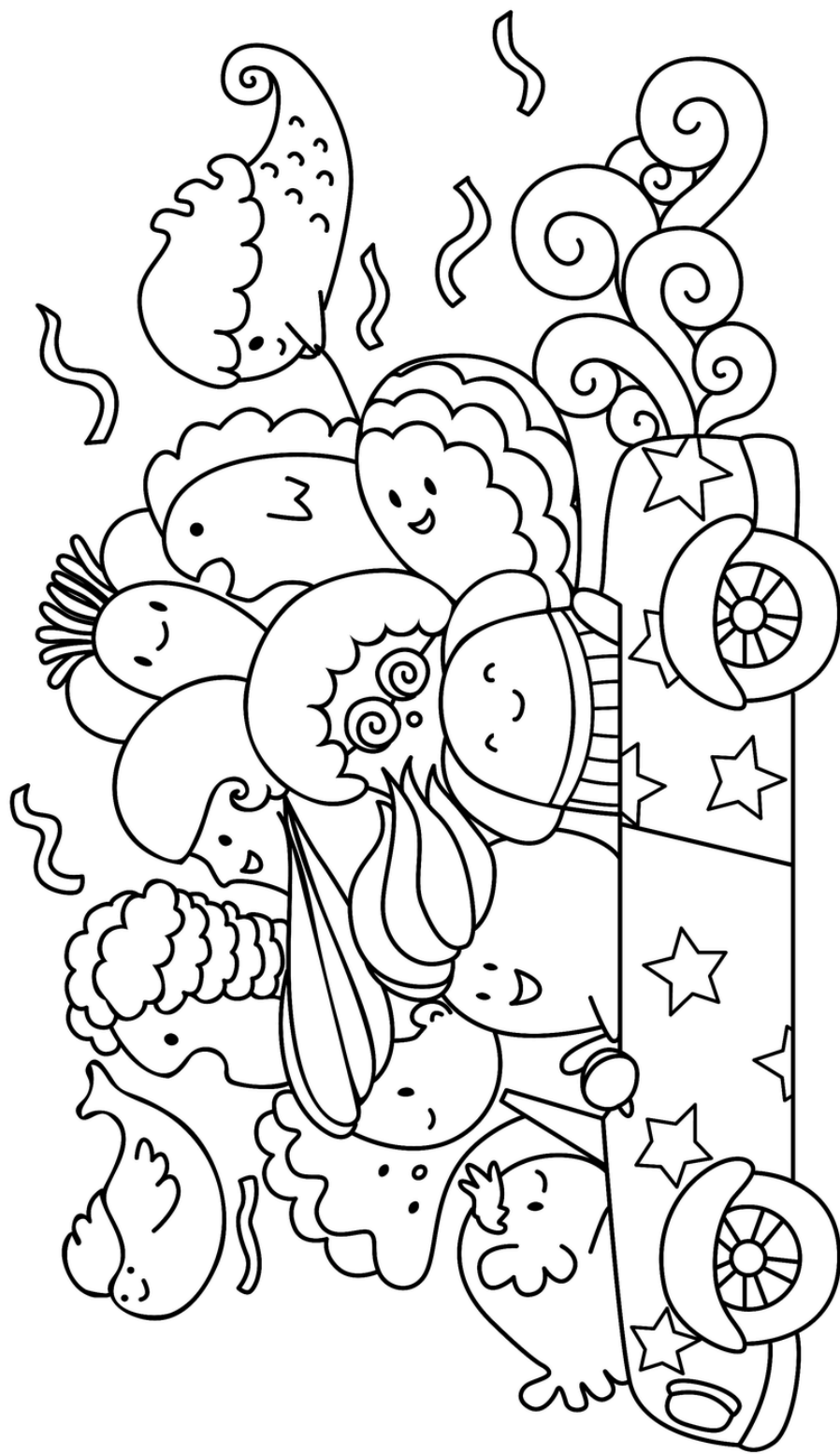

Find the hidden objects in the picture.



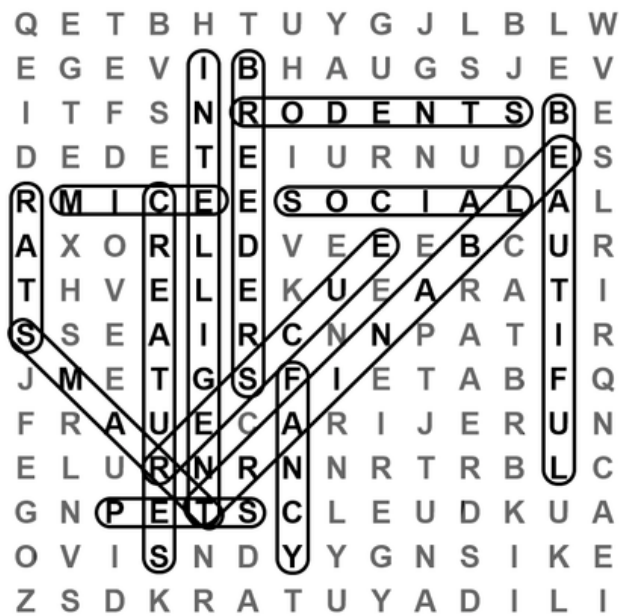


# SOLUTIONS
