DID YOU KNOW? Tomato's Transformation

Before the early 16th century, tomatoes were only found in South America. Spanish colonizers introduced them to Europe, where they became widely cultivated. In France, tomatoes were called "pomme d'amour," or "love apples," due to the belief that they were aphrodisiacs, possibly because they were classified as a type of mandrake, which was considered an aphrodisiac in 16th-century Europe. This belief likely stemmed from the assumption that the Spanish tomatoes shared the aphrodisiac properties of biblical mandrakes.
