On this day in 1903, the Wright brothers changed the world when they completed the first successful flight in a mechanically propelled airplane. The historic moment saw Orville and Wilbur Wright make two flights each from level ground into a glacial headwind blowing at 27 miles per hour. These short flights advanced aviation immensely and led to the state-of-the-art airplanes we have today. The Wright Flyer was the first aircraft to be patented in the United States, but certainly not the last.

Each year on this day, the president makes an annual proclamation inviting Americans to observe Wright Brothers Day with activities and ceremonies in honor of two brothers. Happy Wright Brothers Day, and thank you, Wright Brothers, for helping change the way the world travels!






