Milne's lovable Pooh Bear, as he was fondly called, is a fictional bear inspired by a real black bear named Winnie. Winnie lived at the London Zoo during World War I. The author's son, Christopher Robin, would visit the bear often and named his own teddy bear after her and a swan named Pooh. At any age, there's great wisdom and memories contained in the series of books, which have been translated into more than 50 languages and have spawned much discussion and study. And, of course, the Walt Disney Company turned "Winnie the Pooh" into an animated feature, bringing the delightful characters to millions more.

DID YOU KNOW?

Art of Punctuation

Did you know that the dot on top of a lowercase 'i' is called a tittle? The word "tittle" refers to any small mark or item, and it is mentioned in Mark's Gospel in the Bible: "...till heaven and earth pass, one jot or one tittle shall in no wise pass from the law, till all be fulfilled" (Ch. 5, v 18). This interesting fact adds a unique layer of meaning to something as simple as a punctuation mark.

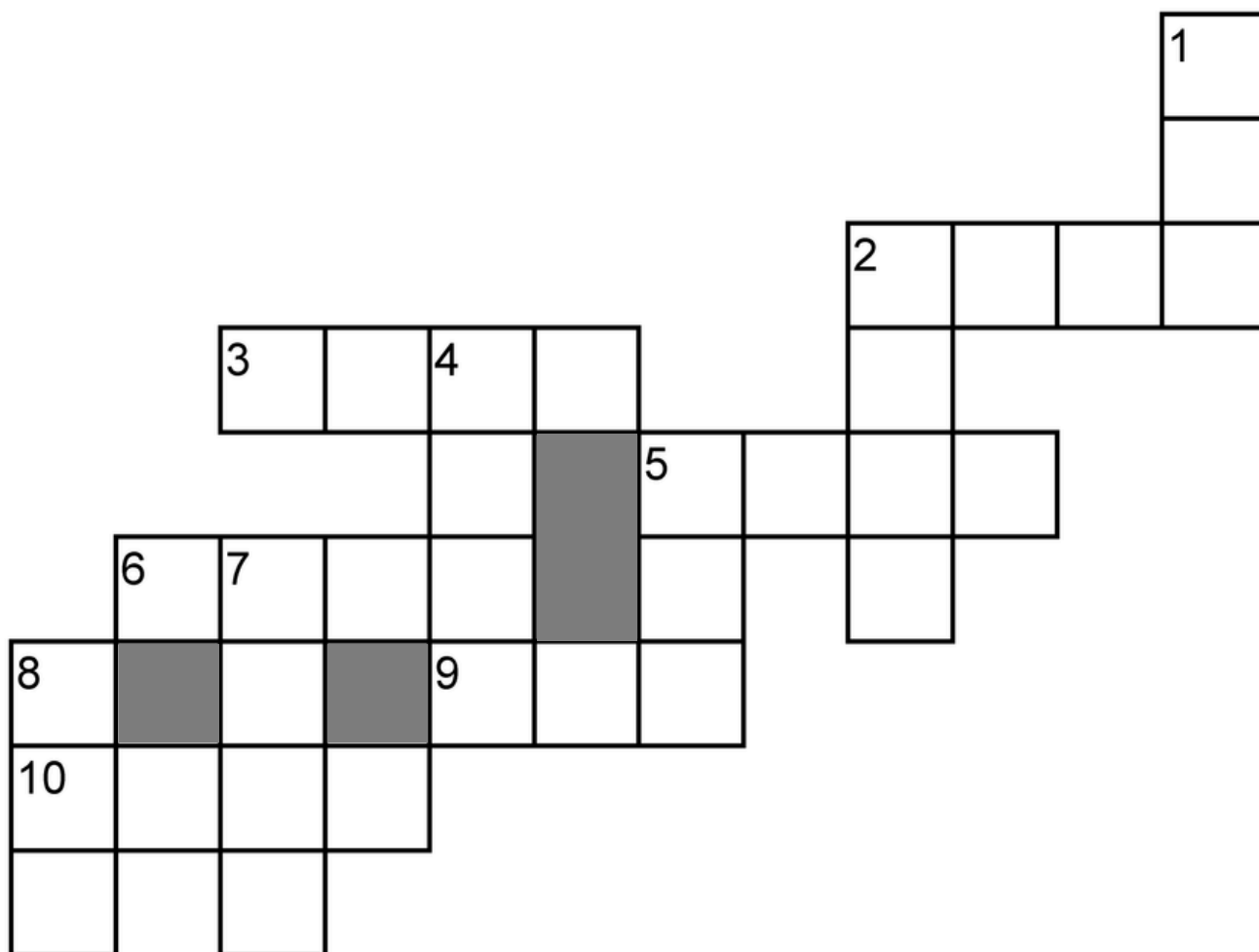

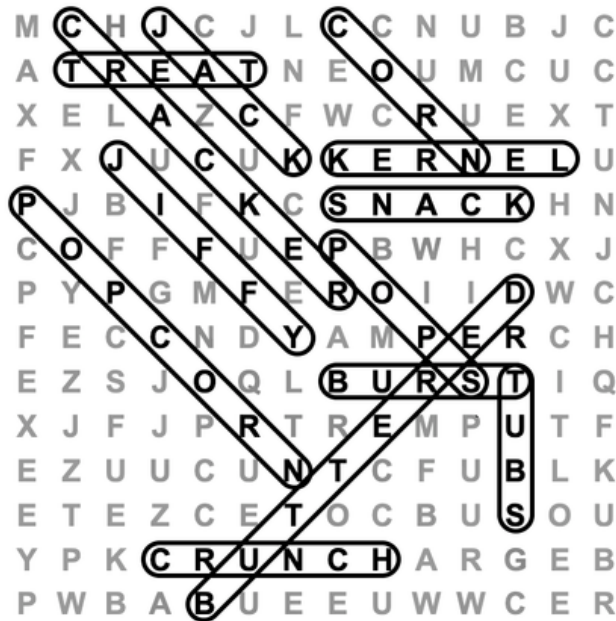
