DID YOU KNOW? Winter Static

Static shocks are more common in winter due to low humidity. When materials like hair and wool hats touch, electrons transfer between them, creating a charge imbalance. Hair tends to lose electrons and become positively charged, leading to shocks when you touch conductive materials like doorknobs. In humid months, moisture allows charges to neutralize continuously, whereas dry winter air holds onto these charges, waiting for contact to create a shock.

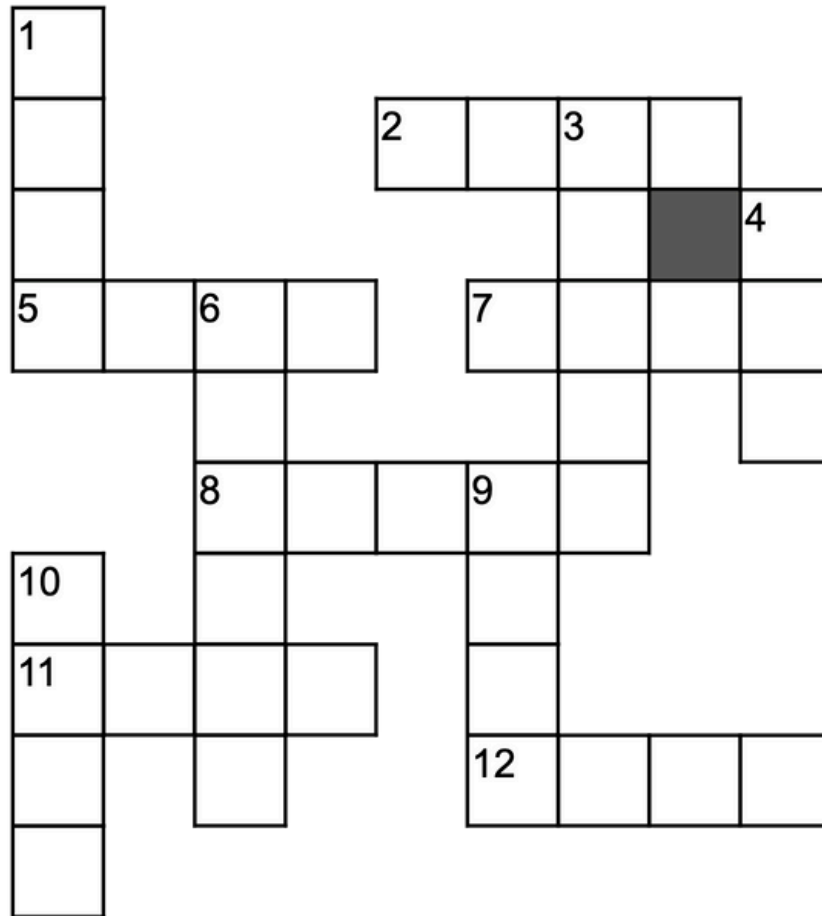

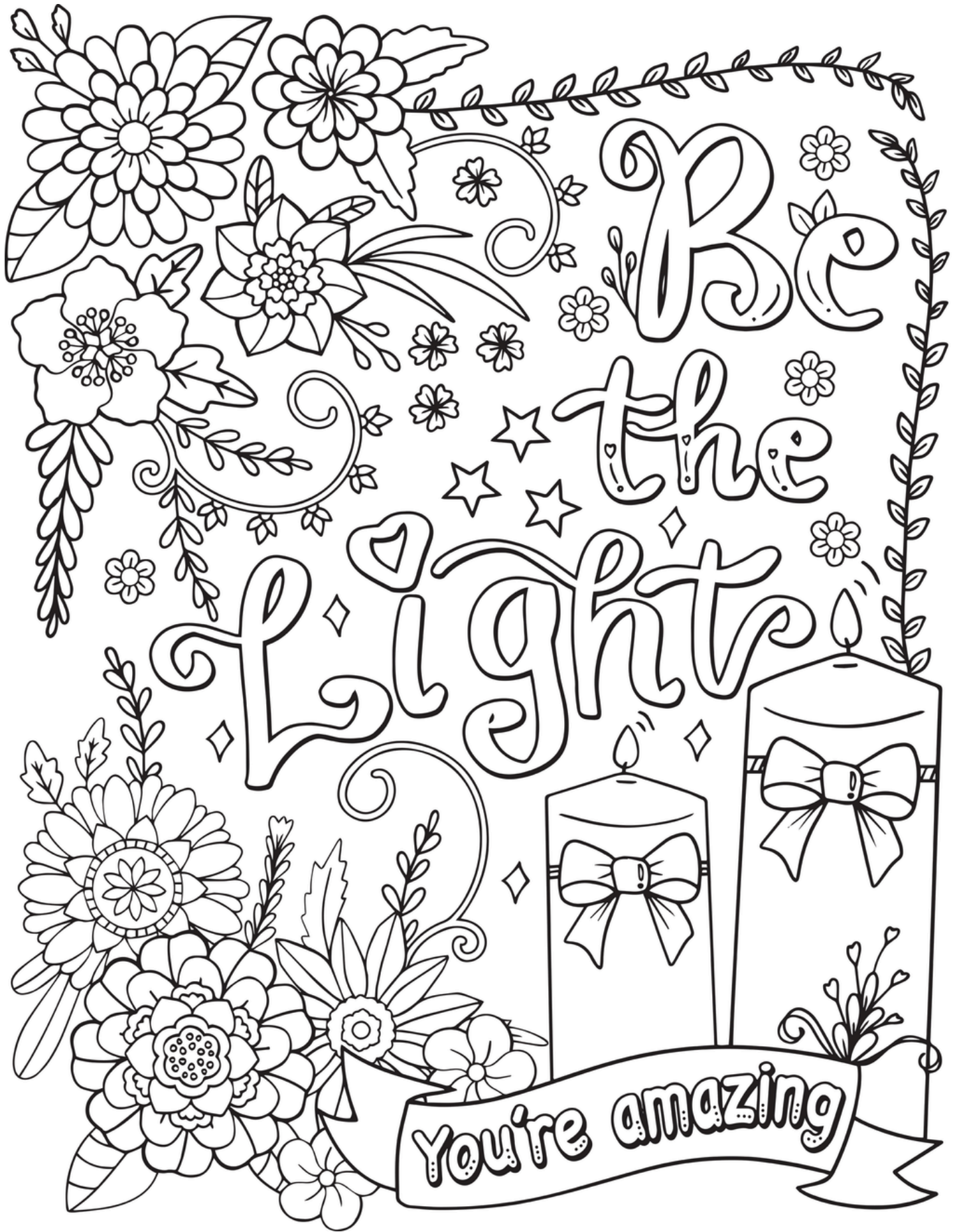

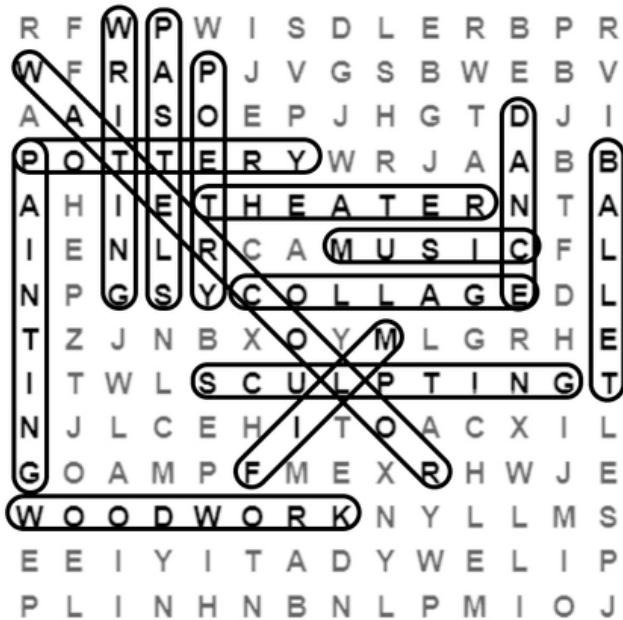


SOLUTIONS

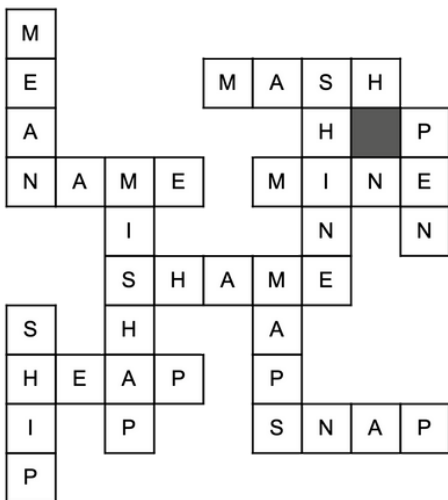
