DID YOU KNOW? Skara Brae: The Hidden Gem of Scotland!

Skara Brae, a Neolithic village, consisted of ten clustered houses made of flagstone with stone hearths, beds, and cupboards. It had a primitive sewer system with toilets and drains in each home that flushed waste into the ocean. Occupied from roughly 3180 BC to about 2500 BC, it is Europe's most complete Neolithic village and is a UNESCO World Heritage Site. Skara Brae is often called the "Scottish Pompeii" due to its exceptional preservation.
