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DID YOU KNOW? Brain Freeze: A Chilly Reminder

A brain freeze is a type of pain called sphenopalatine ganglion neuralgia. It happens when the roof of your mouth or throat gets cold, setting off a chain reaction. First, the blood vessels in your mouth tighten up, and your body tries to warm things up by sending more blood to the area. This activates the trigeminal nerve, sending a pain signal to your brain. While brain freeze isn't harmful, it reminds you that diving into icy treats too quickly can have some chilly side effects.

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
Helpful Tip:




