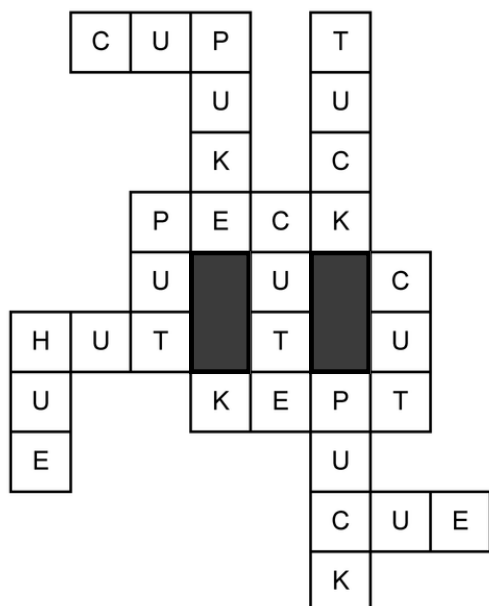
Trivia Answer: C.
