Covered bridges are an idyllic symbol of rural America. The main purpose of the covering was to protect the wooden structure from the elements that cause deterioration. In the 18th and 19th centuries, wooden bridges were common but had short lifespans. Covering them can extend their life significantly; for example, the Hyde Hall Bridge in New York has remained intact for nearly 200 years.






