Snow on Mars

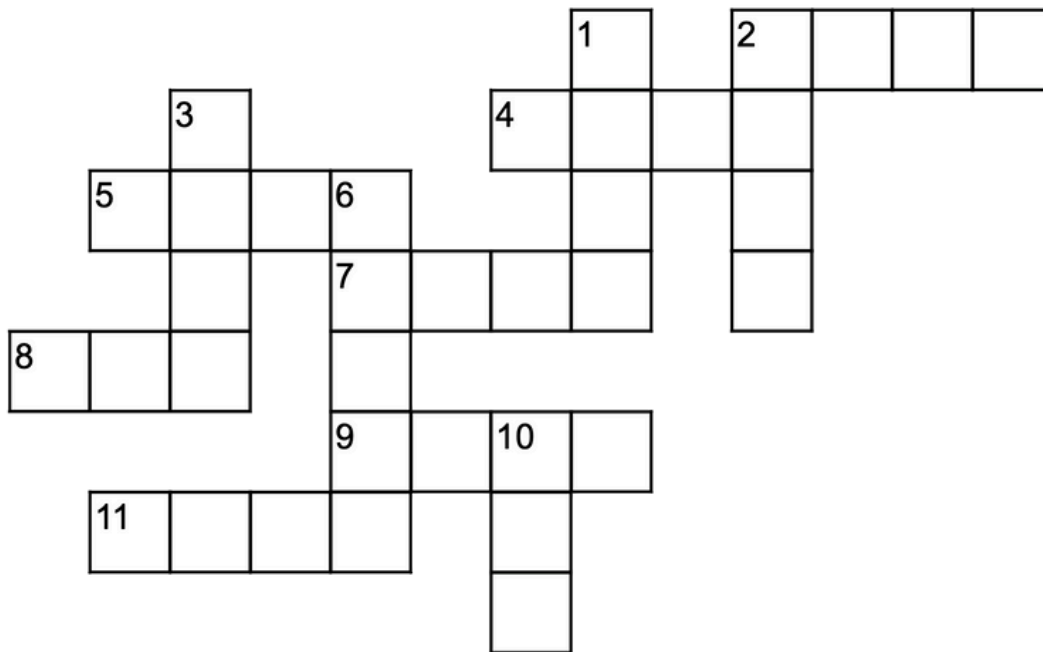

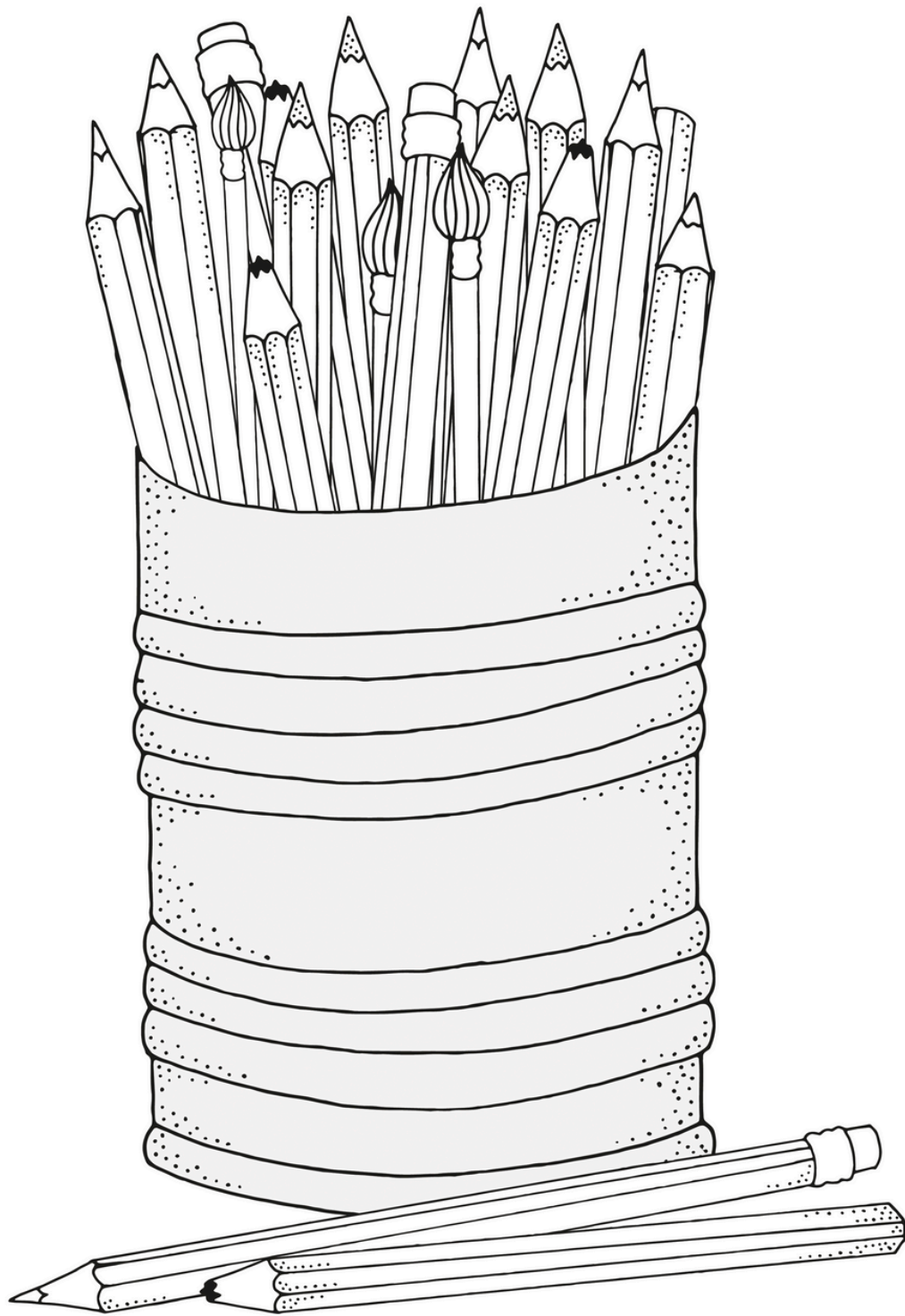

What was your favorite game as a child?

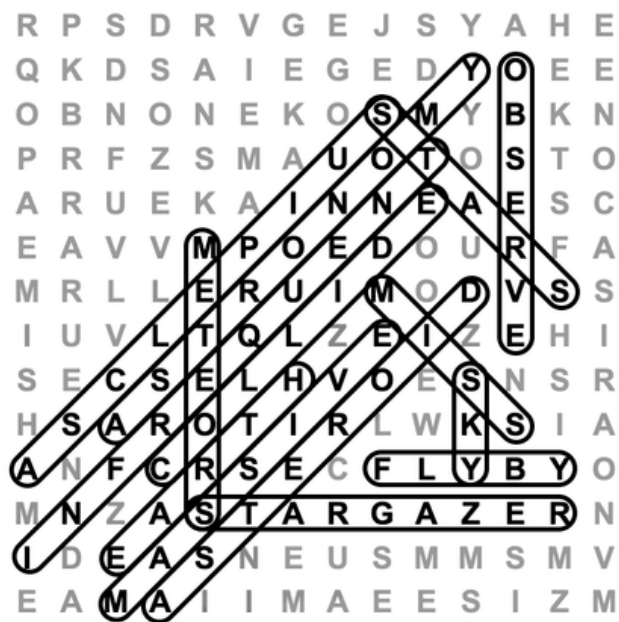
