National One Cent Day

April 1st is the day the United States government issued the first penny! This first one-cent coin had a picture of Lady Liberty with flowing hair. On the other side, the word "ONE CENT" appeared within a chain, which was interlocked with fifteen links. This coin was referred to as the "Flowing Hair Cent." The government produced more than 36,000 of these pennies and circulated them on April 1, 1793. Although this "Flowing Hair" cent coin was supposed to represent Liberty, the sight of the interlinked chain on the other side of the penny reminded some of the oppression by England and angered many. A wreath was used in place of the chain. Now the first U.S. penny is worth a whole lot more than one cent! One of these original pennies sold for almost \$1.2 million in 2015 at an auction in Baltimore.

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DID YOU KNOW? Older Than You Think

Boston, the capital and largest city of Massachusetts and New England is one of the oldest cities in the U.S. Archaeological sites indicate it was inhabited as early as 5000 B.C.E. Early European settlers initially named the area Tramontane but later renamed it after Boston, England, from which several colonists emigrated. Puritan colonists founded the city on September 17, 1630, distinct from the Pilgrims of Plymouth Colony.




