Sundback got the first patent for a "Hookless Fastener" on April 29, 1913. It was initially used as a shoe fastener. In 1937, French designers used zippers in fashion, making them more popular.

In 1967, Aretha Franklin released her single "Respect," which won Billboard Song of the Year. The song was written and originally recorded by Otis Redding. Franklin's cover was at #1 for two weeks and became a feminist anthem for the secondwave feminism movement in the 70s.

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# **DID YOU KNOW?**Forgotten Ocean Treasures

There are an estimated 3 million shipwrecks in the ocean, but less than 1% have been explored due to the vastness of the seas and the high costs of expeditions. While some wrecks are looted or transformed into underwater museums, many become reefs, providing habitats for fish and marine life. Although they may not be as famous as the Titanic, these wrecks serve important ecological roles beneath the surface, contributing to the ocean's biodiversity.




# **SOLUTIONS**
