DID YOU KNOW? Super Bowl Ad

Apple's 1984 Super Bowl ad was the first time that Super Bowl commercials were considered something to watch in addition to the game itself. The ad was a reference to George Orwell's 1949 novel about a dystopian future ruled by a televised "Big Brother." The ad created so much media attention that it earned an estimated \$150 million worth of free airtime for the Macintosh. It only aired once on national television, which some critics say was a stroke of advertising genius.

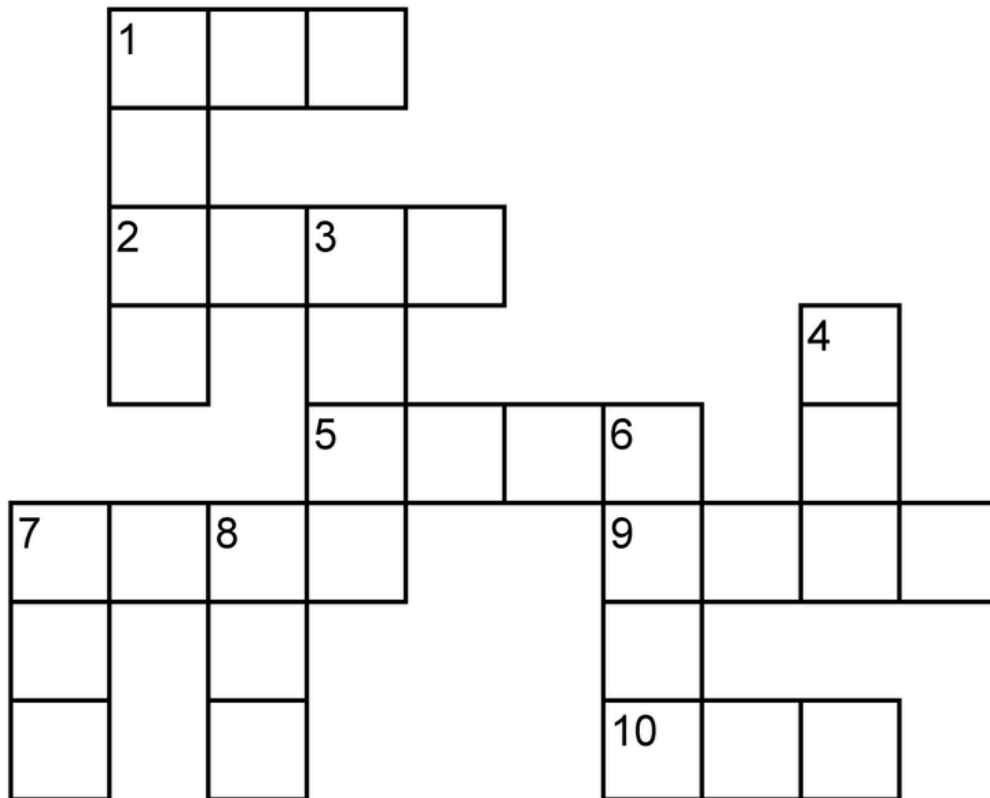

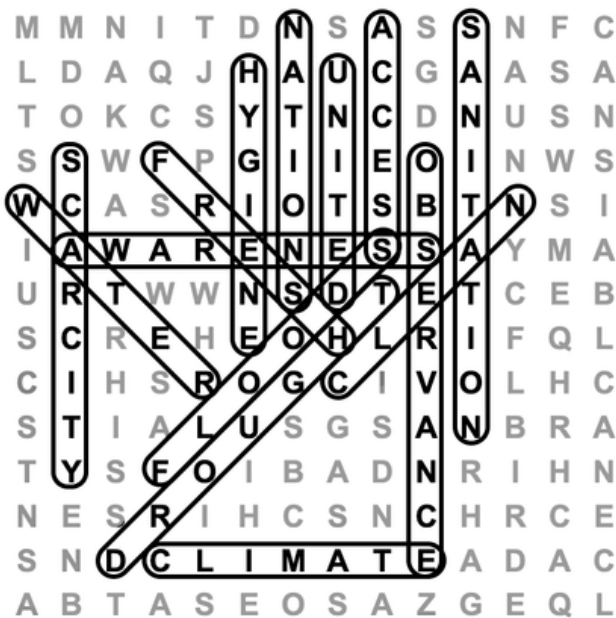

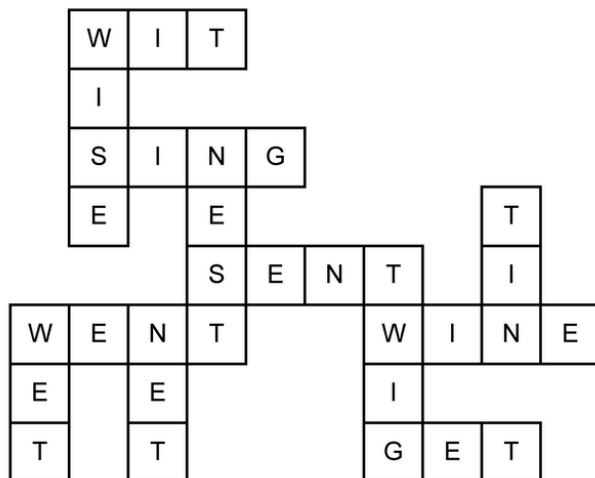
Trivia Answer: B
