


# Today in History ::::



In 1975, Linda Ronstadt released her cover of "When Will I Be Loved" by the Everly Brothers. The song made it to number 2 on the charts. She was inducted into the Rock and Roll Hall of Fame in 2014. Ronstadt won 12 Grammys, an Emmy, and two American Country Music Awards.

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# DID YOU KNOW? Linguistic Legacy of Tolkien

A philologist by trade, Tolkien kept his mind exercised by inventing new languages, many of which (like the Elvish languages Quenya and Sindarin) he used extensively in his writing. He even wrote songs and poems in his fictional languages. In addition, Tolkien worked to reconstruct and write in extinct languages like Medieval Welsh and Lombardic. His poem "Bagm Ä? Blom Ä" ("Flower of the Trees") might be the first original work written in the Gothic language in over a millennium.

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
# **Helpful Tip:**






# **SOLUTIONS**
