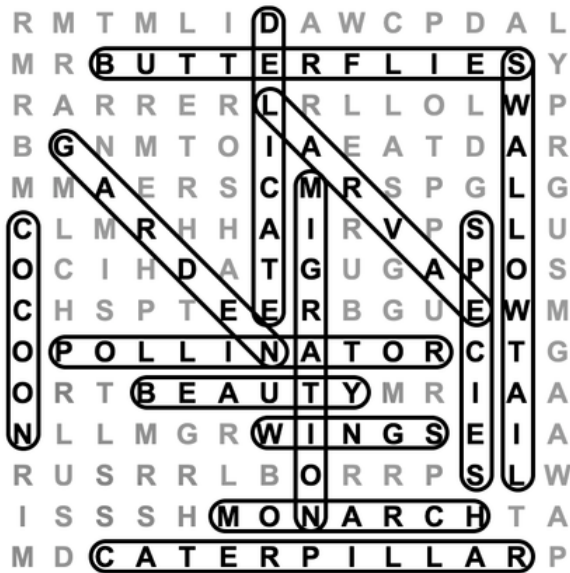




SOLUTIONS
