National Feed The Birds Day

As the long, cold winter drags on, why not help the birds by throwing them a few seeds on Feed the Birds Day? Feed the Birds Day first occurred in 1994 as a way to get people to feed birds during the coldest part of the winter where snow is plentiful and food for them is scarce. Due to snow covering what little food they have available, placing a bird feeder outside or just going out and spreading some seed by hand can go a long way to helping the birds get some much needed nourishment while vou get some much needed winter entertainment.

Nutrient-rich seeds include black-oil sunflower, nyjer (or thistle seed), white proso millet and sunflower chips, but avoid using red milo seed (sorghum), as birds won't eat it.

DID YOU KNOW? Glass Ceiling Breaker

Susan La Flesche Picotte (1865–1915) was a Native American doctor and reformer in the late 19th century. She is known as one of the first Indigenous women to earn a medical degree. Also, as an active social reformer, she worked to discourage drinking on the reservation where she worked as a physician. Picotte campaigned to prevent and treat tuberculosis, of which at the time there was no cure. During her career, Picotte served over 1,300 patients in a 450-square-mile area.






