1. Carnegie Hall When the New York Philharmonic moved to Lincoln Center, Carnegie Hall was put up for sale. Isaac Stern spearheaded efforts to save and restore it, the restoration was completed in 1986.

9. New Amsterdam New York City started as a trading post created by colonists from the Dutch Republic in 1624 on Lower Manhattan; the post was named New Amsterdam in 1626.

13. Giants, Horace Stoneham decided to move his club to San Francisco to help introduce Major League Baseball to the west coast.
14. Holland Tunnel The Holland Tunnel is the oldest of the vehicular tunnels, opening to great fanfare in 1927 as the first mechanically ventilated underwater tunnel.
15. Brooklyn Bridge The Brooklyn Bridge was built in 1883 and was the first bridge to provide passage across the East River between Brooklyn and Manhattan, back when Brooklyn was still an independent city.
16. Grand Central Station - the largest train station in the world and is the busiest building in New York City in terms of visitors.
17. Bill de Blasio
18. Four The Polo Grounds in Manhattan, which the New York Giants shared with the Yankees for several years and was the first home of the New York Mets; Shea Stadium in Flushing, the Mets' home since 1964; The Yankees also played at Shea during the renovation of Yankee Stadium. Ebbets Field in Brooklyn, where the Dodgers played until the end of the 1957 season. The Giants also played in the Polo Grounds until the end of that season. No one blames the Giants for moving to San Francisco, but a lot of us are still angry with the Dodgers! Citi Field was built in 2009 as the home for the Mets.
19. Theodore Roosevelt born on East 20th Street.
20. Riker's Island The isle of Manhattan has over 30 islands around it. Riker's is one of the largest and is a city unto itself, having its own schools, stores, medical facilities, ball fields, chapels, gyms, and a power plant. Only about ten miles from The Statue of Liberty, Riker's can hold about 15,000 inmates.
