

MEMORABLE MOVIES QUIZ

Memorial Day is a holiday for remembering and honoring fallen members of the Armed Forces. Can you guess these war-themed Memorial Day movies? (Answers are on page 6)

- This 1979 classic film follows Martin Sheen as an Army captain who sets out on a dangerous mission to kill an American colonel. The drama led to eight Oscar nominations, including Best Picture and Best Director.
- 2. This famous movie makes you feel the need for speed. This gutsy fighter pilot encounters both an epic romance and bromance!
- This 1989 movie portrays a soldier's feelings of patriotism after becoming paralyzed during his second tour in Vietnam.
- 4. An oldie here, 1946, When Fred, Al and Homer return from World War II, adjusting to civilian life isn't as seamless as they had anticipated. This classic took home seven Oscars, including Best Picture.
- 5. What a hit this 2014 movie was. Directed by Clint Eastwood and starring Bradley Cooper, we follow the life of a Navy SEAL. Regarded as the most lethal sniper in military history.
- 6. This 1962 movie depicts those forces who stormed the beaches of Normandy 1944. This movie is still considered one of the best World War II films of all time.



- 7. William Dafoe and Charlie Sheen join together in this film about the Vietnam War. Caught between his two superiors, Sheen's character faces more battles than he ever imagined.
- 8. We'd be remiss if we didn't mention the 1989 movie about the first unit of African-American soldiers who fought in the Civil War. Based on the true story of Robert Gould Shaw, there's conflict and camaraderie in this powerful film.
- 9. John Wayne stars as a commander fighting to show the efficacy of PT boats in World War II. Along with his pal they demonstrate how unstoppable they can be though they may not be able to overcome their biggest challenge in the Philippines.
- 10. This movie is a slang term used to refer to US Marines. The film was released in 2005 and chronicles the life story of the marine as he is serving in the Gulf War period.

IN FLANDERS FIELDS A POEM

The World War I poem "In Flanders Fields," by John McCrea, inspired the Memorial Day custom of wearing red artificial poppies. In 1915, a Georgia teacher and volunteer war worker named Moina Michael began a campaign to make the poppy a symbol of tribute to veterans and for "keeping the faith with all who died." The sale of poppies has supported the work of the Veterans of Foreign Wars.

In Flanders fields the poppies blow
Between the crosses, row on row,
That mark our place; and in the sky
The larks, still bravely singing, fly
Scarce heard amid the guns below.
We are the Dead. Short days ago
We lived, felt dawn, saw sunset glow,
Loved and were loved, and now we lie,
