Star Sand

Star sand is a rare and beautiful type of sand found on the Taketomi, Hatoma, and Iriomote islands in Japan. It consists of small, star-shaped pieces. This unique sand comprises exoskeletons from single-celled organisms known as Foraminifera, specifically *Baculogypsina sphaerulata*, only found in East Asia's coral reefs. Unlike typical beach sand, star sand showcases the remnants of these tiny creatures, creating a stunning shoreline attraction.

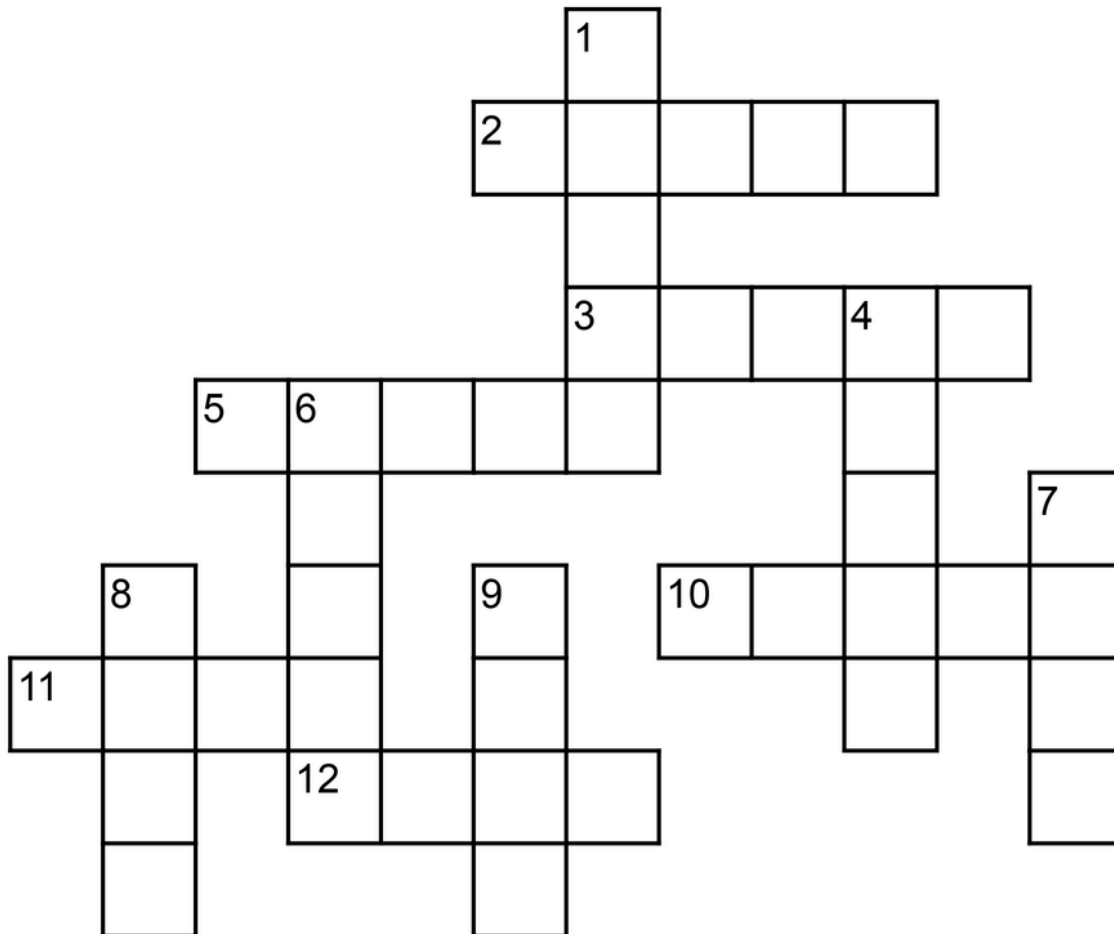

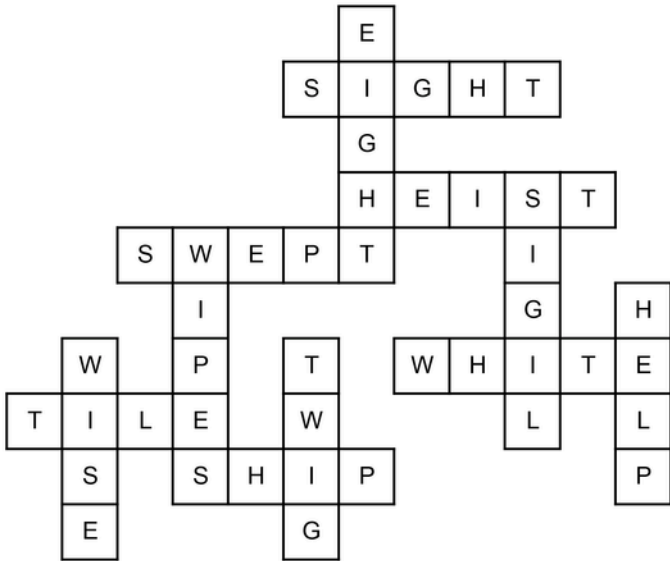
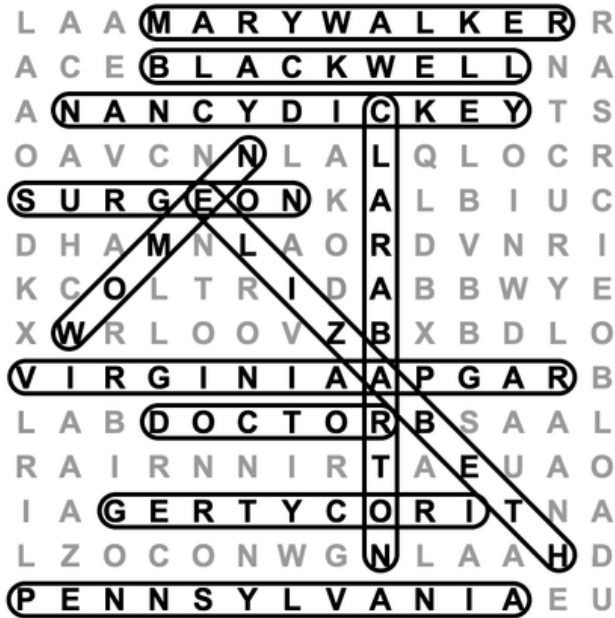
SOLUTIONS
