


### DID YOU KNOW? Bionic Nose

Researchers at Virginia Commonwealth University are creating a neuroprosthetic device to help individuals with anosmia regain their sense of smell. The device converts odors into radio waves, transmitting signals directly to the brain, much like cochlear implants. Users wear a sensor that sends aromas, potentially allowing them to smell again if the device is successfully developed.
