National Iris Day

Long, graceful stems and delicate, iridescent petals in a rainbow of colors are a sure sign of Spring. It's no wonder the gorgeous iris has its own day to shine on National Iris Day, May 8th. The name 'iris' comes from the Greek word for 'rainbow,' and it's believed that Iris was the messenger of the gods - a rainbow link between sea and sky. The iris holds a particular place of honor in Belgium, where May 8th is quite significant. It is a symbolic day for the victory over the Nazis in World War II.

In addition, Iris Day takes place on the same day as the Feast of Saint Michael the Archangel, who is considered to be a patron saint of the city of Brussels, the capital of Belgium.

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


DID YOU KNOW? Rome's Hidden Pyramid

While pyramids are often associated with Egypt, the Pyramid of Cestius in Rome is a unique testament to ancient architecture. Built around 12 BCE, it rises to nearly 120 feet with steeper slopes than Cairo's. Once accompanied by the now-demolished Pyramid of Romulus, Cestius' tomb reflects the Roman fascination with Egyptian culture. Today, it remains the only ancient pyramid still standing in Europe, a remarkable relic amid the city's historical landscape.






