Alcatraz Beyond the Bars

Alcatraz, established as a federal prison in 1934, was designed for tough inmates but had its redeeming qualities. The first warden ensured good food to prevent riots, with meals like bacon, jambalaya, and pork roast. Prisoners benefited from single cells, basic rights, and privileges for good behavior, such as work opportunities and music.

Surprisingly, Alcatraz gained a better reputation than some federal prisons, leading some inmates to request transfers to "The Rock."

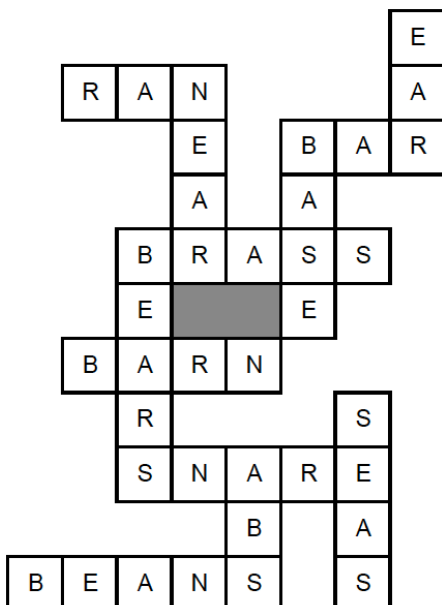
Trivia Answer: C.
