Hidden Tunnels of Harvard

Harvard University boasts an extensive network of underground tunnels that provides access to most campus buildings, allowing students to traverse the grounds without stepping outside. Originally built to house essential utility lines—such as steam pipes, power cables, and telecommunications—the tunnels have become a popular recreational route for many students. Notably, in 1939, a German spy cleverly evaded capture by the FBI by utilizing these secretive passageways, adding to their intriguing history.
