From Names to Numbers

Telephone numbers debuted in 1879 during a measles epidemic in Lowell, Massachusetts allowing new operators to work without knowing all local subscribers' names. Initially, management feared customers would find this numerical system dehumanizing. By the 1960s, as communities switched from alphanumeric to all-digit systems, resistance grew, leading to the formation of the Anti-Digit Dialing League to remind authorities that real people were more than just numbers.

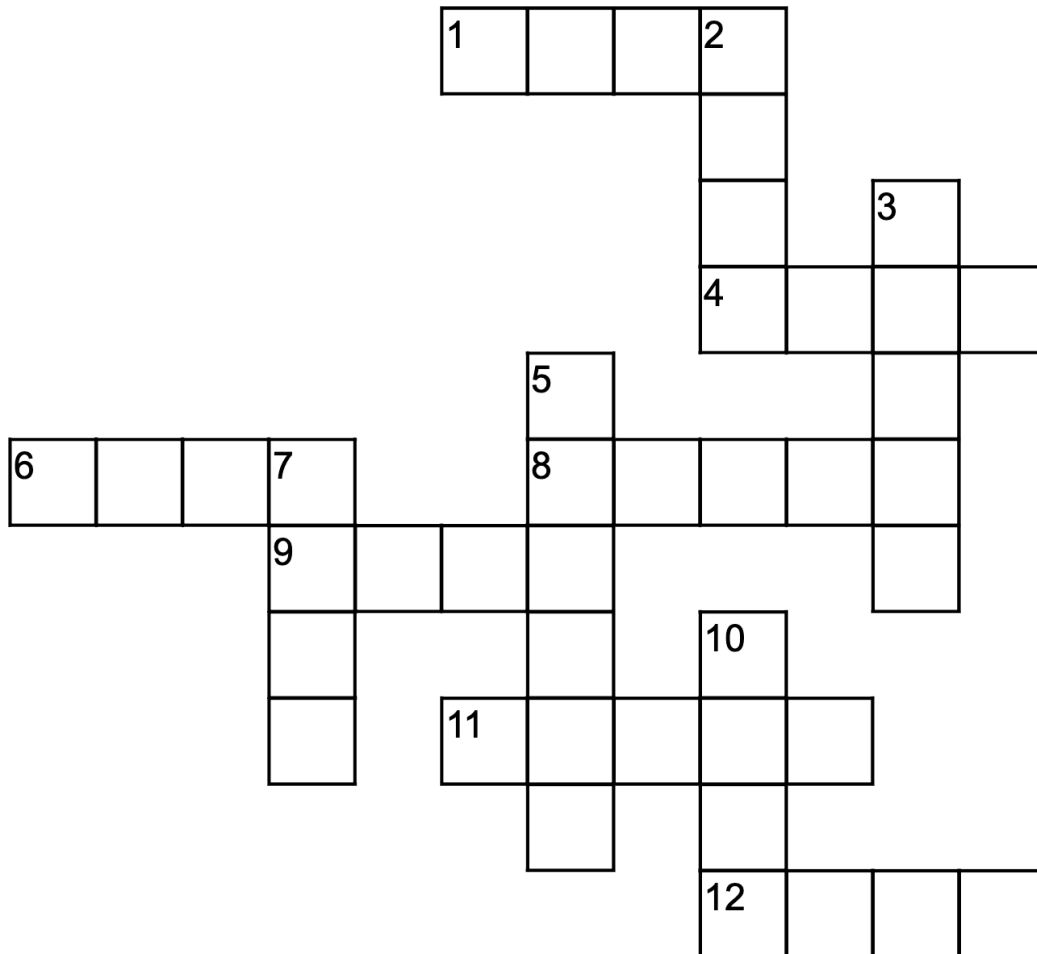

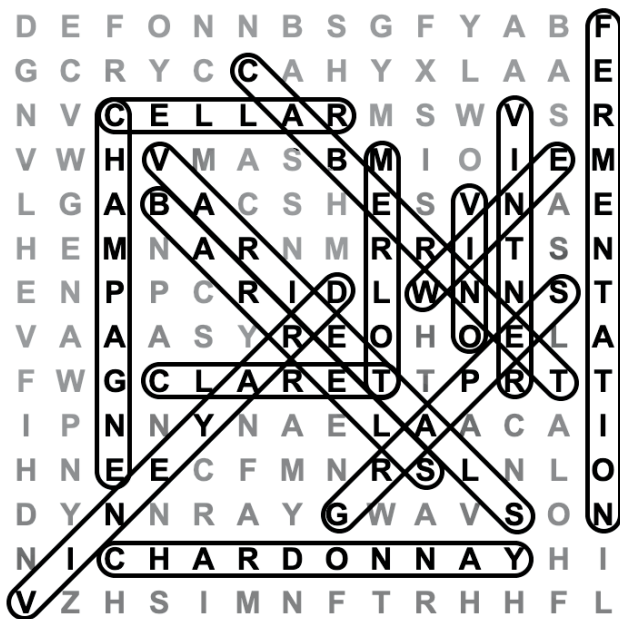

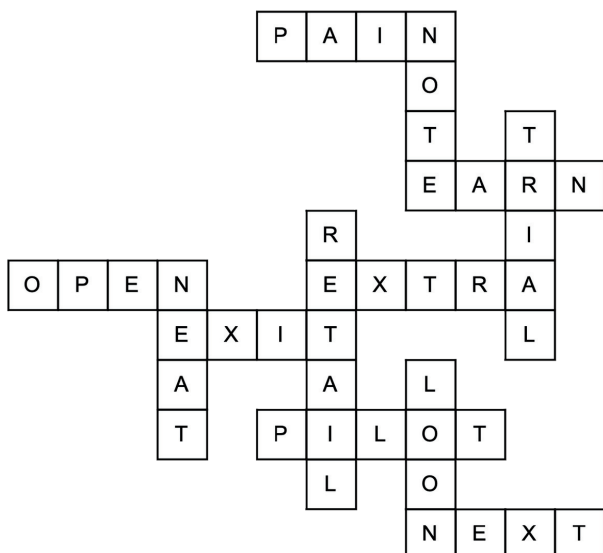
