National Barrier Awareness Day

May 7th is National Barrier Awareness Day, a day dedicated to finding ways to break down obstacles and dissolve stigmas that keep people with disabilities from advancing, especially in education. It's an opportunity to tear down walls and build ramps that provide access, and eliminate ineffective or outdated policies preventing those with disabilities from accessing their full potential.

Approximately 36 million Americans suffer from some form of handicap, and around eighty percent of Americans will experience some disability in their lifetime. That makes it necessary for people to understand and appreciate both the barriers that those who are disabled must surmount and the tremendous contributions that they can make to our society.



Today in History



In 1959, "Roy Campanella Night" drew 93,103 fans for an exhibition game, the largest baseball crowd at the L.A. Coliseum. Nicknamed "Campy," Campanella was a catcher for the Brooklyn Dodgers during the 1940s and 1950s. He was inducted into the Baseball Hall of Fame in 1969.

Tuxedo Trendsetter Triumph

Pierre Lorillard's family was a wealthy tobacco magnate with property in Tuxedo Park, near New York City. At a formal ball in October 1886, he introduced a new style of men's formal wear by removing the tails from his Tailcoat and wearing a Satin Lapel Dinner Jacket he designed. He named this tailless black jacket *The Tuxedo*, after Tuxedo Park. *The Tuxedo* quickly gained popularity and became fashionable as formal wear for men.

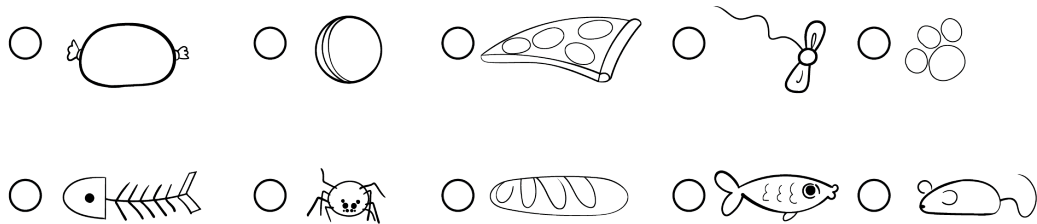

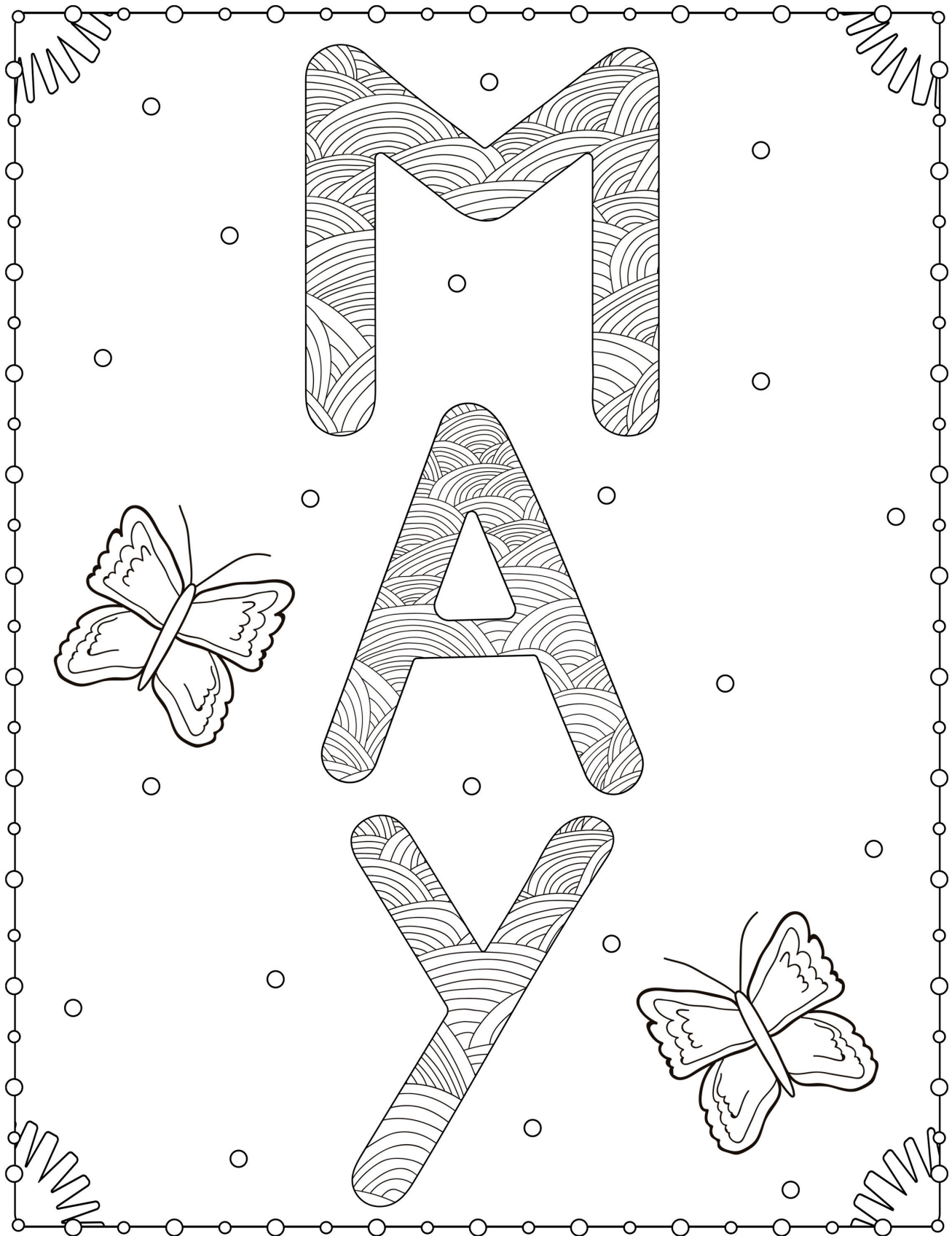

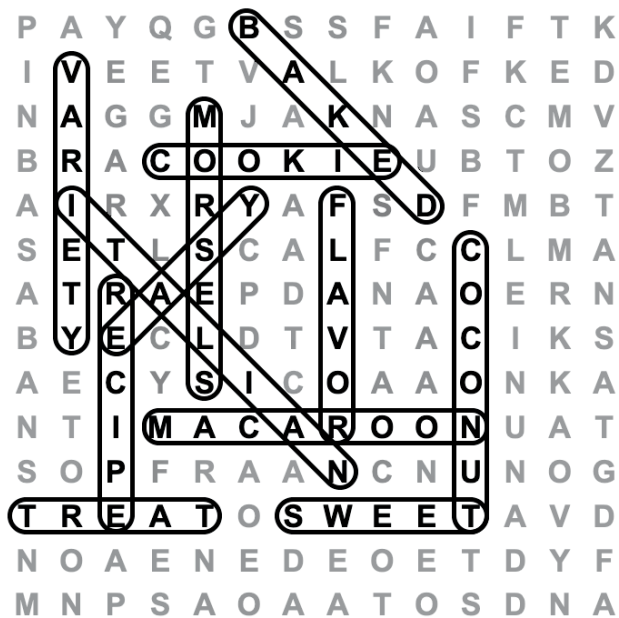




SOLUTIONS
