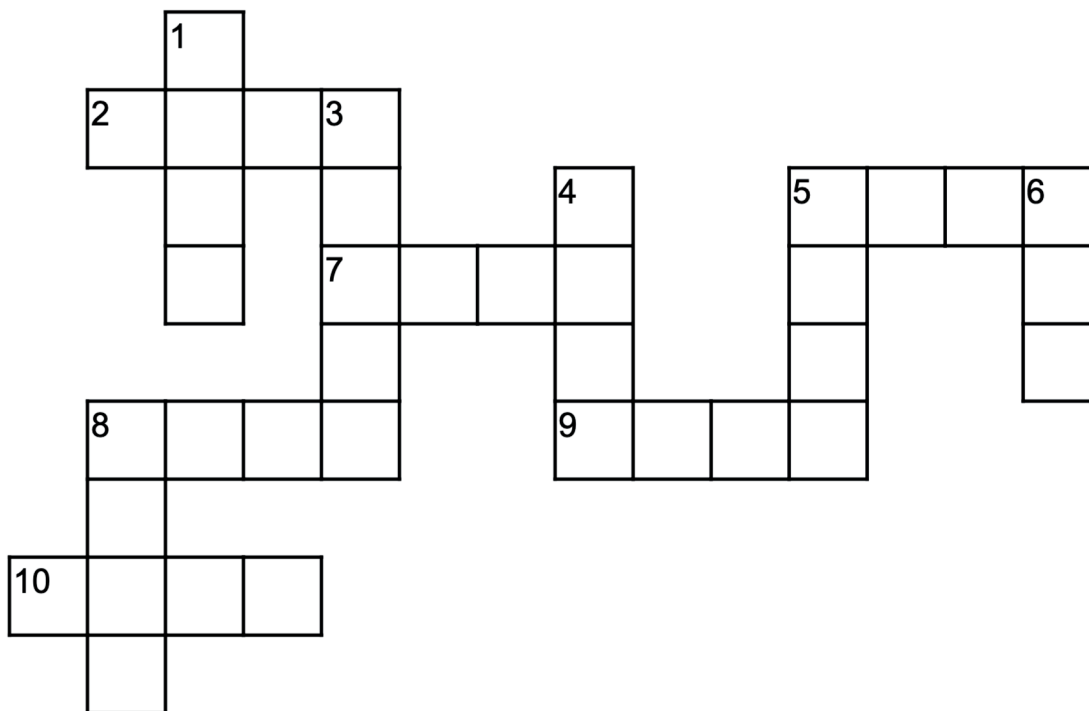

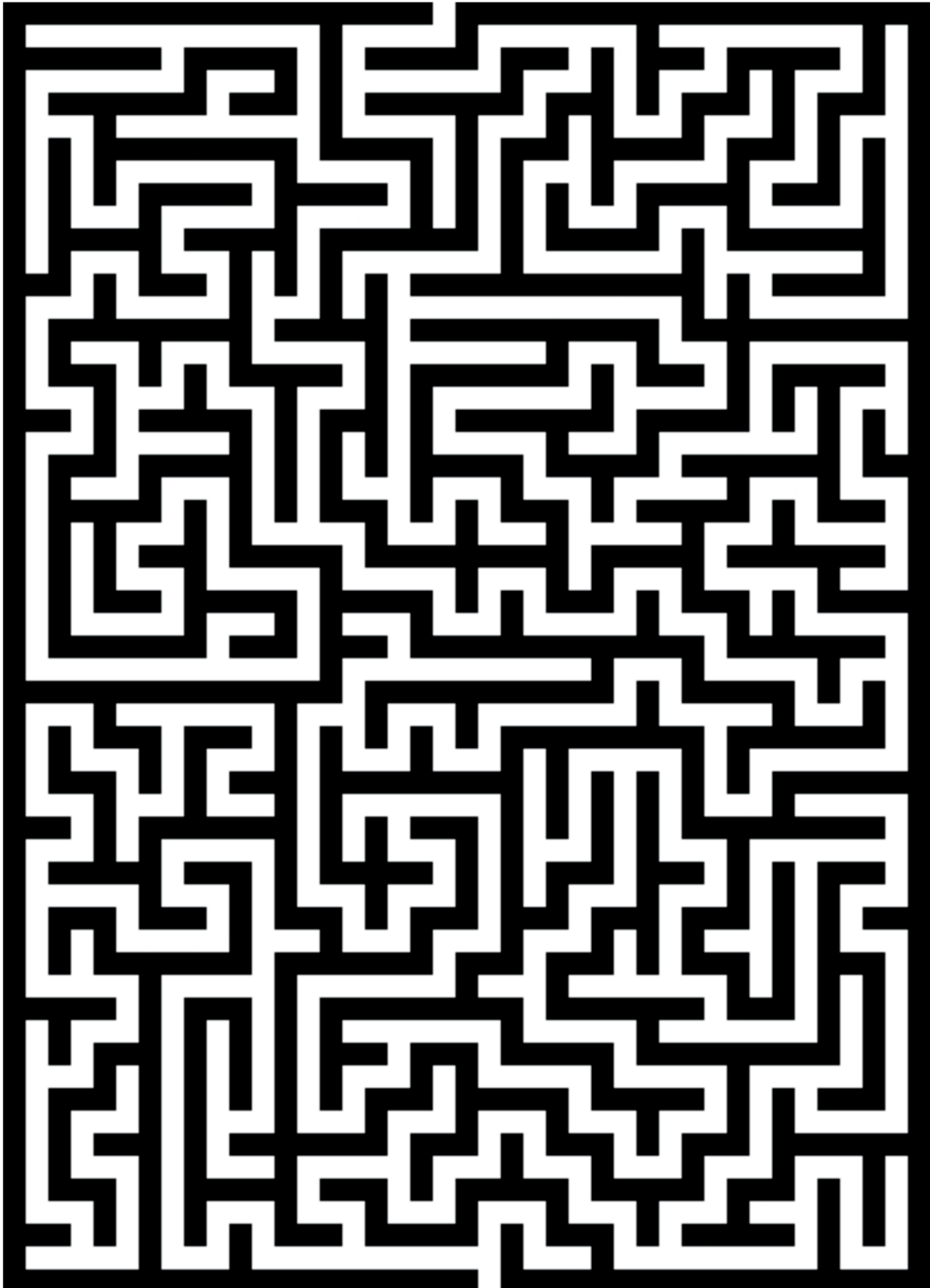

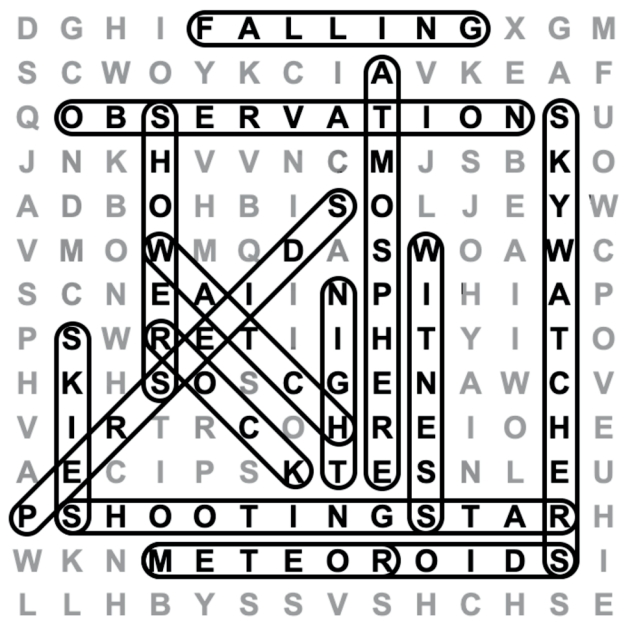




SOLUTIONS
