National Megalodon Day

The ocean is full of fascinating creatures, but none were as fierce as the mighty Megalodon! Megalodon, meaning "big tooth," lived millions of years ago and ruled the oceans. It fed on whales, sharks, and other large sea animals. This massive monster was the largest type of shark to ever live, measuring over 60 feet in length and biting its prey with 276 razor-sharp, seven-inch teeth. And although the Megalodon had six rows of teeth, that's not a smile you'd want flashed in your direction! Fossils of Megalodon teeth have been found off the coast of North Carolina, home to the Aurora Fossil Museum.

Today, the Megalodon is long extinct, but National Megalodon Day lives on and is celebrated each June 15th.
