# Twig and Raffia Star Ornament



## Supplies:

- 5 Twigs (about the same diameter as a pencil)
- Raffia
- Hot glue gun

### Instructions:

### Step 1

Take your 5 sticks, and with your hot glue, glue them togther in the shape of a star.

### Step 2

With the raffia, take one end and tie it onto the star. once done start wrapping it around the star.

# Twig Tree Ornament



## Supplies:

- 4 Twigs
- Yarn or Tinsel
- Hot glue gun

#### Instructions:

### Step 1

With the hot glue gun, glue 3 of the sticks together. Make sure one of your sticks out of the 4 is shorter then the other. The smaller one will become your base.

### Step 2

Once the glue has fully tried, glue one end of the yarn around a corner of the tree. Then start wrapping.

# Seashell Angel Ornament



### Supplies:

- Seashell
- Lace Ribbon
- Gold ribbon
- Gold glitter
- Pink paint
- · White beads
- · Round wooden bead

### Tools:

- · White craft glue
- Paintbrush
- Hot glue gun
- Scissors
- Extra fine point marker

### Instructions:

- 1. Take the lace ribbon, cut a piece thats 12 -inchs long. Tie it into a bow and set it
- 2. Next take the gold ribbon, loop it into the wooden bead Glue it into place.
- 3. Paint the white craft glue onto the seashell, then cover it with the gold glitter.
- 4. Hot glue the wooden bead to the pointed end of the shell, gluing the excess ribbon from the bead inside the shell. Glue the shell and bead to the lace bow you tied in.
- 5. Dip the paintbrush in pink paint. Bristles should be almost dry. Apply light pressure to the wooden bead to add the pink cheeks.
- 6. Use an extra fine point marker to add the eyes and mouth. Glue white beads around the "neck" of the angel (I used a small section of a thrift store necklace).



# **Star Ornament**

## Supplies:

- 2 Cardboard Squares
- Scotch Tape/glue
- Yarn or string
- Metal pins
- Patterned paper

#### Instructions:

- 1. Take a strip of tape or glue and adhere one square onto the other making a square-diamond fashion.
- 2. Take the patterned paper and cut it just slightly smaller than your cardboard squares and use glue or tape to fashion it onto the cardboard diamond.
- 3. Then take 8 of the pins and push one gently into each corner you see. you want them to be sticking out slightly because they're going to catch the yarn as you weave.
- 4. Turn over your cardboard shape, take a piece of tape and fasten the end of your yarn to the back of the star.

- 5. "2 down, 1 up" referring to the pattern. You start by taking the yarn from behind the star, going overtop of one pin, going down 2 pins (following the edge of the square) and going around that pin. Going around and repeating the process moving down
- 6. You are all done when there is no more space in between the points of the star to move toward the center of the star anymore while moving to the left of the previous round. small section of a thrift store necklace).

# **Icicle Ornament**



### Supplies:

- Metallic pipe cleaners
- Pony Beads
- Yarn or thread

### Instructions:

- 1. Start by threading the beads on to the pipe cleaner.
- 2. You can stop the beads from sliding all the way down by twisting the pipe below and above the beads
- 3. To give your icicle a spiral effect, wind the pipe cleaner around a pencil, and then slide it off, and stretch it out a bit.

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
