Porcupines possess up to 30,000 quills that lie flat until the animal feels threatened. Despite common misconceptions, porcupines cannot shoot their quills; instead, they naturally shed old ones as new ones continuously grow at a rate of 1 millimeter every two days. While not poisonous, New World porcupine quills are particularly hazardous due to barbed tips that expand within a warm, moist wound.

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


