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DID YOU KNOW? Big Brains

The ant genus *Brachymyrmex*, which includes 44 species, has the largest brain-to-body ratio of any known organism at 1 to 8. Its brain weighs just 0.006 milligrams, while its body weighs about 0.049 milligrams. Although a single ant has only 250,000 neurons compared to around 86 billion in a human, Entomologists consider ants, along with bees and termites, to be among the most intelligent insects.

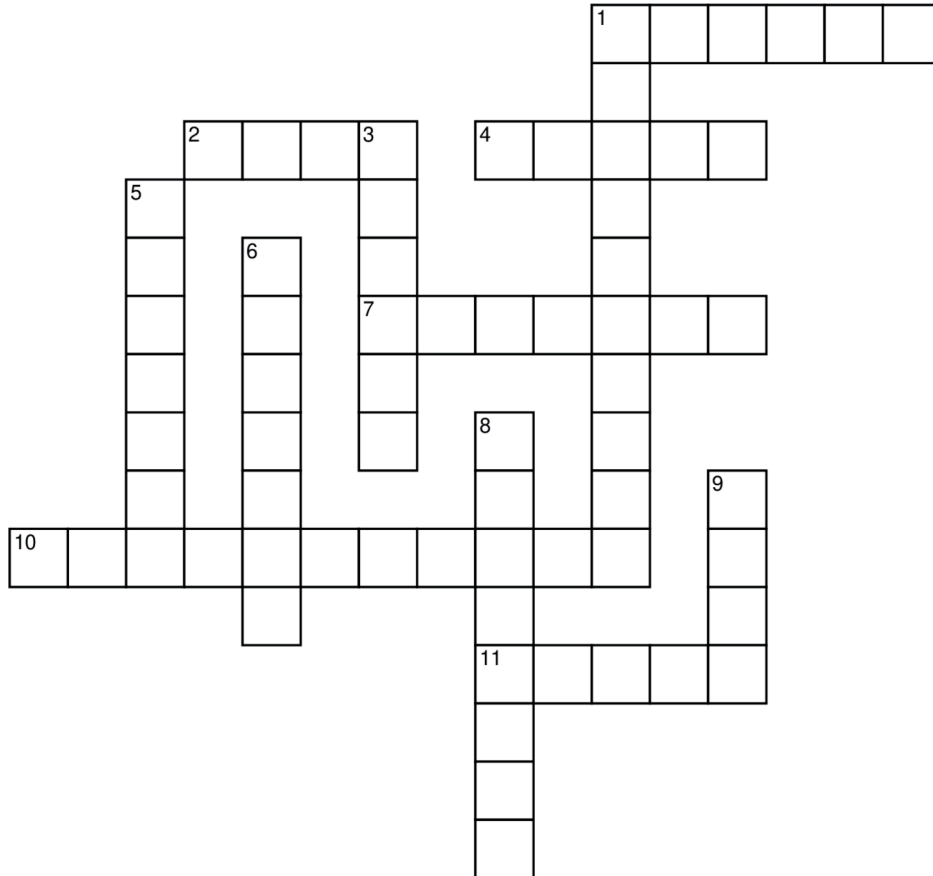

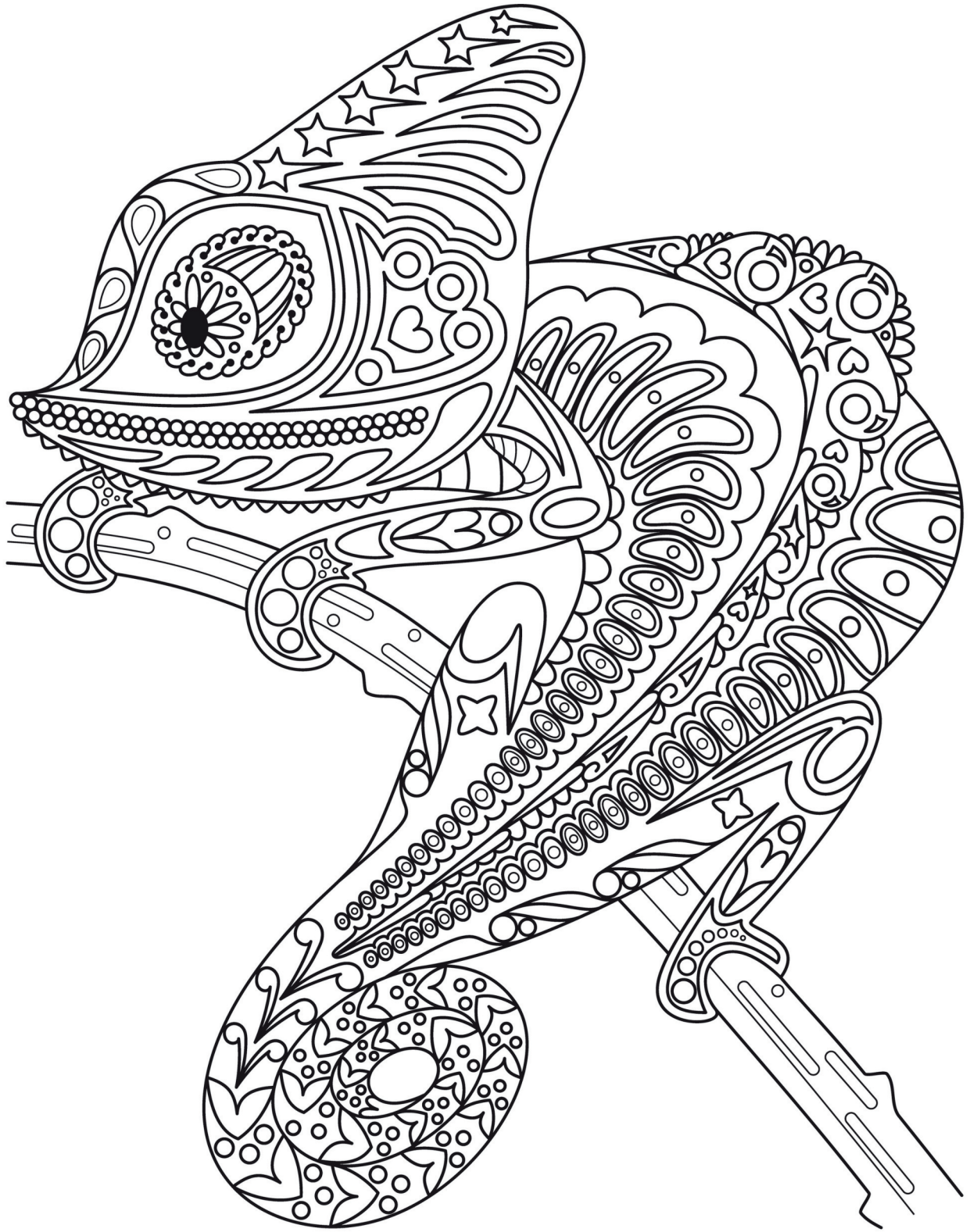
