

DID YOU KNOW? Last Woolly Mammoths

Woolly mammoths coexisted with early humans, surviving even after the Egyptians constructed the Great Pyramid of Giza. These giant creatures were last found on Wrangel Island, Russia, where they faced serious challenges due to inbreeding and genetic decline. The final woolly mammoth is believed to have died around 1700 BCE, long after the pyramid was completed. Exciting advancements in genetics could potentially restore this iconic species to Earth.






