National Moon Day

"One small step for man, one giant leap for mankind." On July 20th, 1969, at 10:56 p.m., Neil Armstrong spoke those words as he became the first man to walk on the moon. The Apollo program and the Apollo 11 mission fulfilled President John F. Kennedy's plan to have an American on the Moon by the end of the 1960s. During the time the Apollo program was active, a total of twelve astronauts walked on the surface of the moon.

The Apollo program was shut down in December 1972 after the successful, final manned landing of Apollo 17. That mission was the last time mankind stepped foot on the moon. Today, our flag still stands on the lunar surface as a testament to the American spirit and the bravery of the first astronauts.



Today in History



In 1969, Neil Armstrong and Buzz Aldrin landed on the surface of the moon, carried by Apollo 11. Both astronauts walked on the moon seven hours after they landed. Armstrong was the 1st man to walk on the moon and said "That' one small step for man, one giant leap for mankind."

DID YOU KNOW? Ancient Japanese Calendar

Ancient Japan's calendar featured 72 microseasons. each lasting under a week and highlighting nature's subtle changes. Originating from the lunisolar calendar, these microseasons were defined by natural shifts like "last frost, rice seedlings grow," and "crickets chirp around the door." Revised in 1685 by astronomer Shibukawa Shunkai, the calendar captures the essence of Japan's weather, encouraging mindfulness of the environment amidst the challenges of climate change.






