DID YOU KNOW?Coffee Filter Revolution

In the early 1900s, Melitta Bentz invented disposable coffee filters to simplify brewing. Previous methods were messy and often left bitter coffee. Seeking a better process, Bentz used notebook paper as a filter, creating a drip system that cleaned up easily. She patented her design in 1908 and, with family support, launched a line of drip coffee makers. Today, her company produces nearly 50 million filters daily.


