The Rod of Asclepius

The rod of Asclepius, showcasing a single snake entwined around a staff, symbolizes modern medicine. Originating from ancient Greek mythology, Asclepius was a famed physician taught medicinal secrets by a healing snake. This symbol is prominently featured in the logos of organizations like the World Health Organization. In contrast, the caduceus, with two snakes and wings, represents Hermes and has been used by the U.S. Army Medical Corps since 1902.

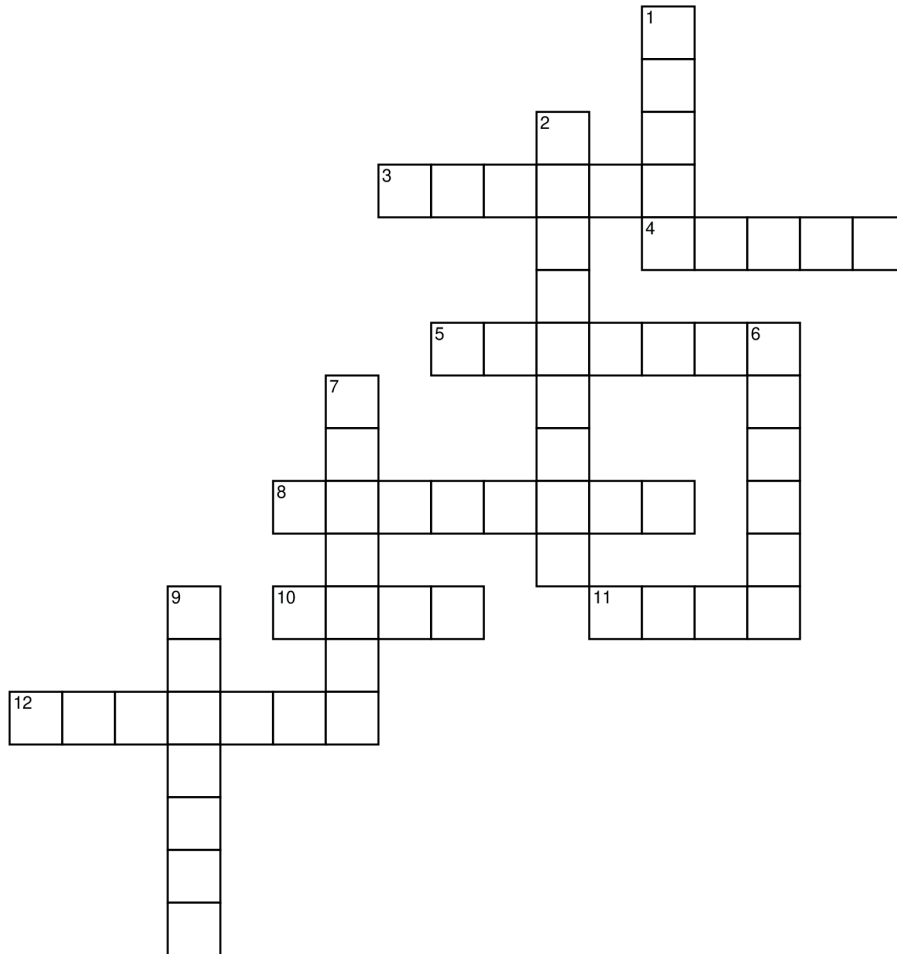

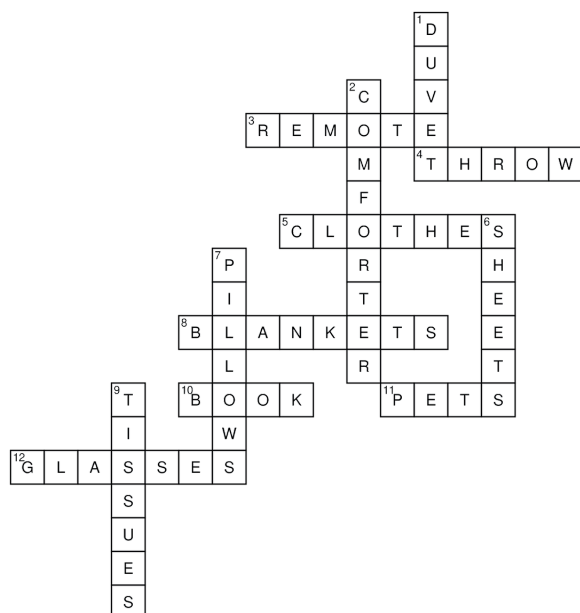
