Wayne Almost Assassinated

John Wayne, aka Marion Morrison, aka "Duke," angered Joseph Stalin by his anti-communist stance so much that Stalin dispatched two Russian hit men to take him out in 1951. But the FBI was aware of the plot and captured the men before they could fulfill their task. Biographer Michael Munn claims that Stalin's successor, Nikita Khrushchev, told Wayne he rescinded the execution order during a private meeting the two had in 1958.

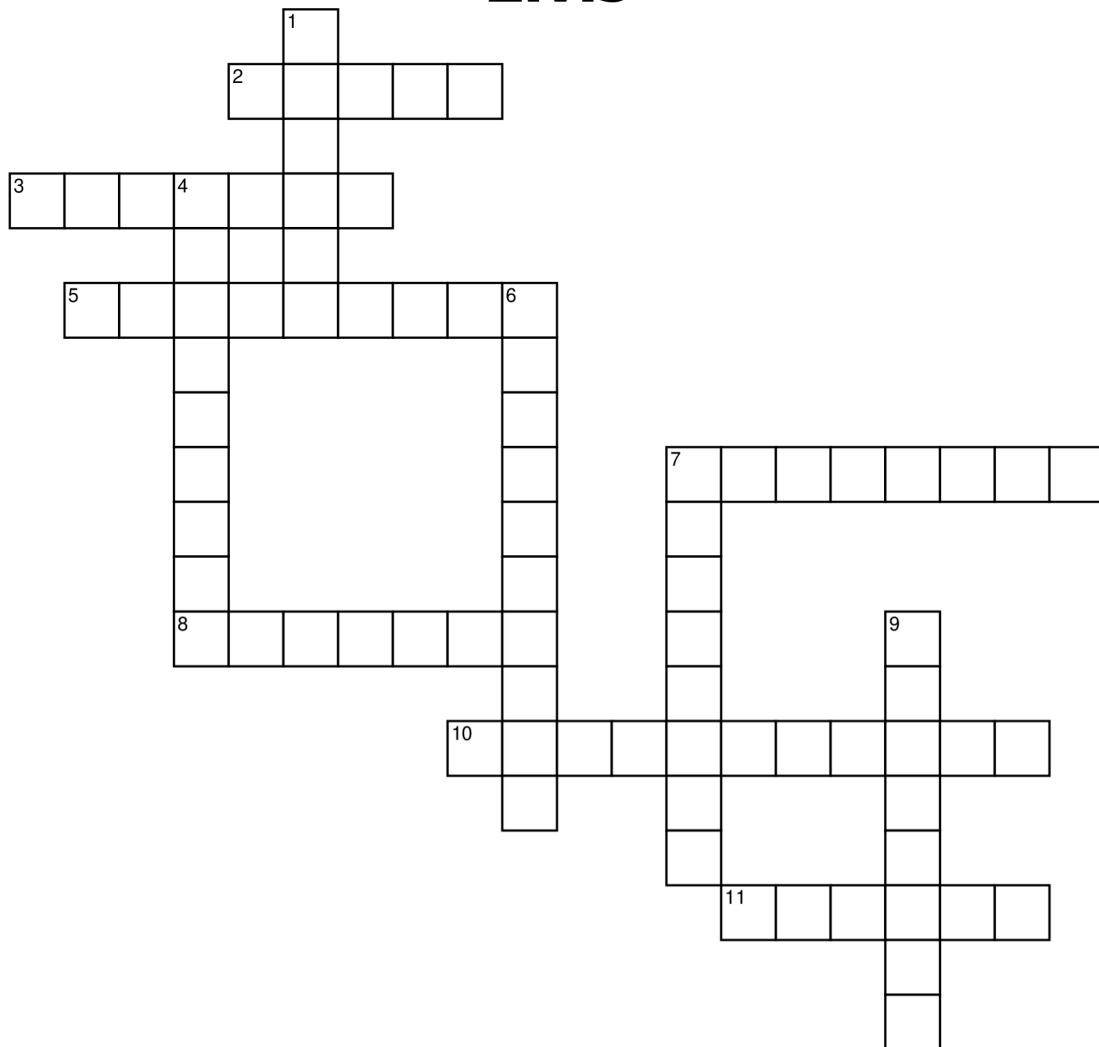

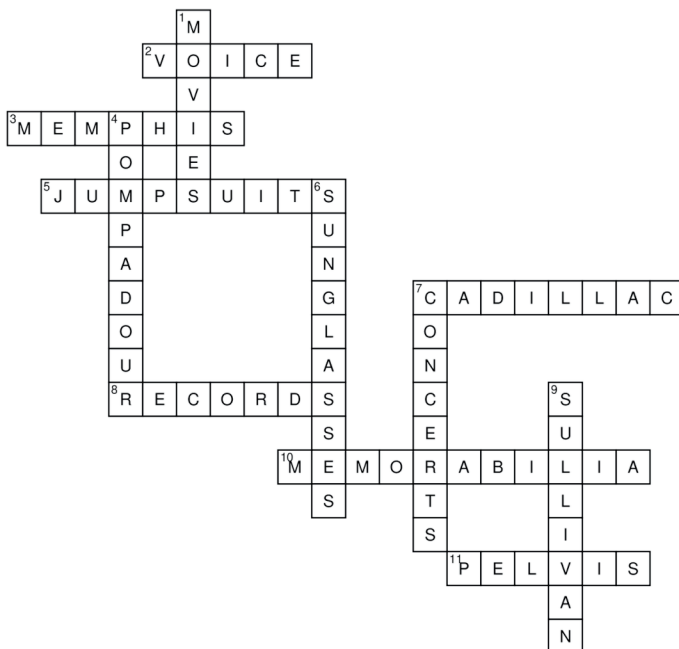
