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DID YOU KNOW? Sounds before the Samurai were Abolished

The first sound recording predates the abolition of the samurai in Japan. While samurai symbolize a feudal past, sound recording emerged as a modern innovation. U.S. Navy Commodore Matthew C. Perry's arrival in 1853 marked the beginning of the end for the samurai, culminating in the Meiji Restoration. Although Thomas Edison's 1877 recording of "Mary Had a Little Lamb" is famous, French inventor Édouard-Léon Scott de Martinville made earlier recordings in the 1860s.

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
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Helpful Tip:




