### Speedy Coffee Break

Three Italian inventors contributed to the creation of espresso. Angelo Moriondo patented a steam coffee machine in 1884, but it could only brew large batches. Nearly two decades later, Luigi Bezzera developed an espresso machine that reduced brewing time to 30 seconds, catering to workers. With Desiderio Pavoni's help, their revamped machine debuted at the 1906 World's Fair in Milan, where they sold "caffè espresso."

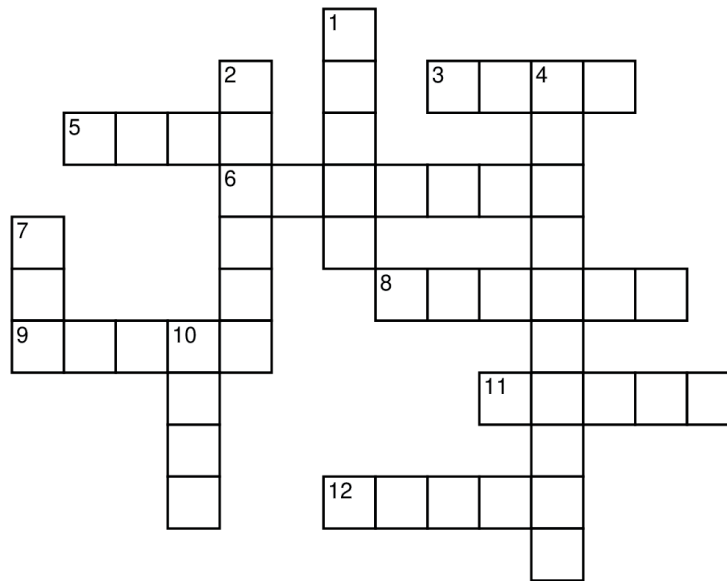
## Helpful Tip:

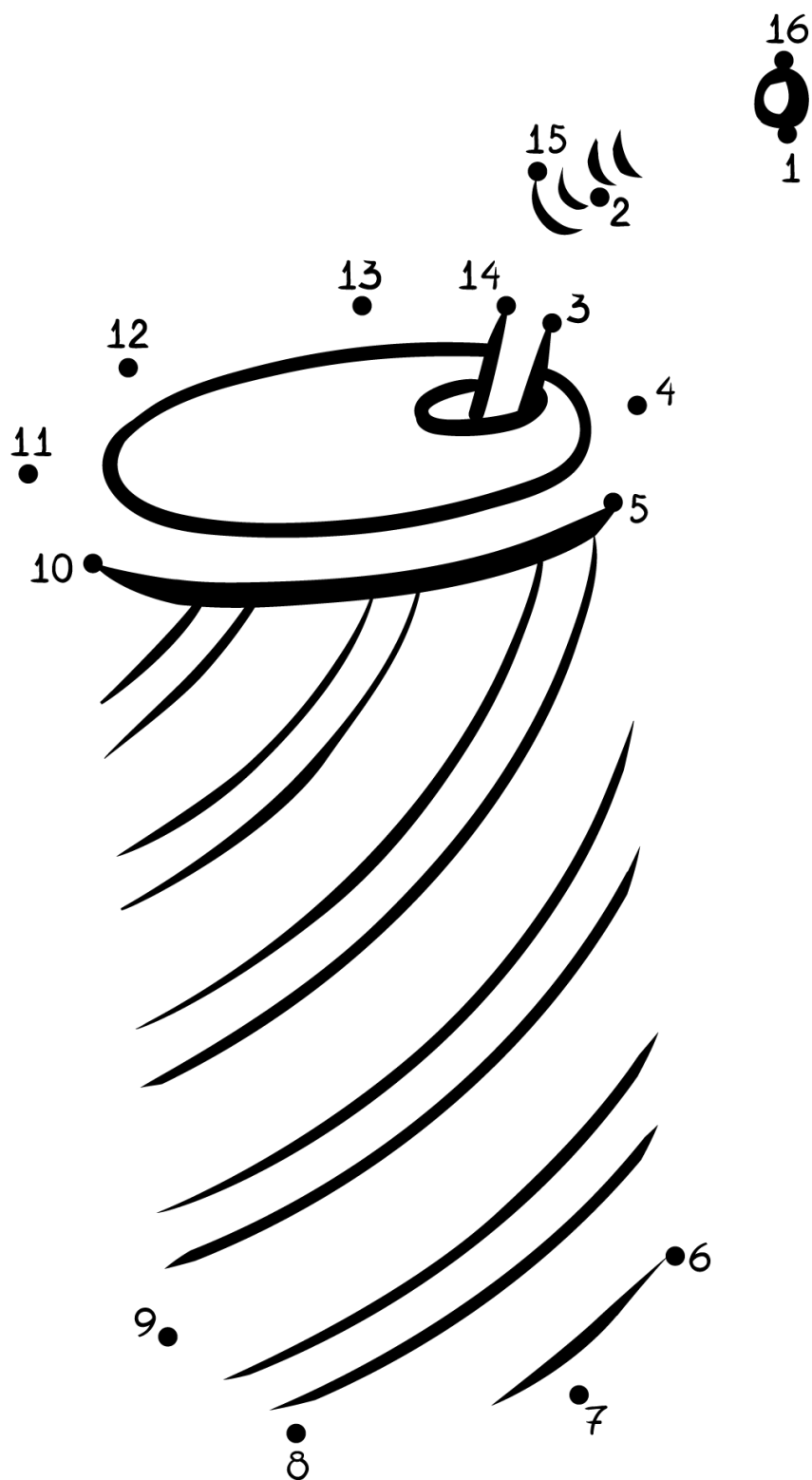
