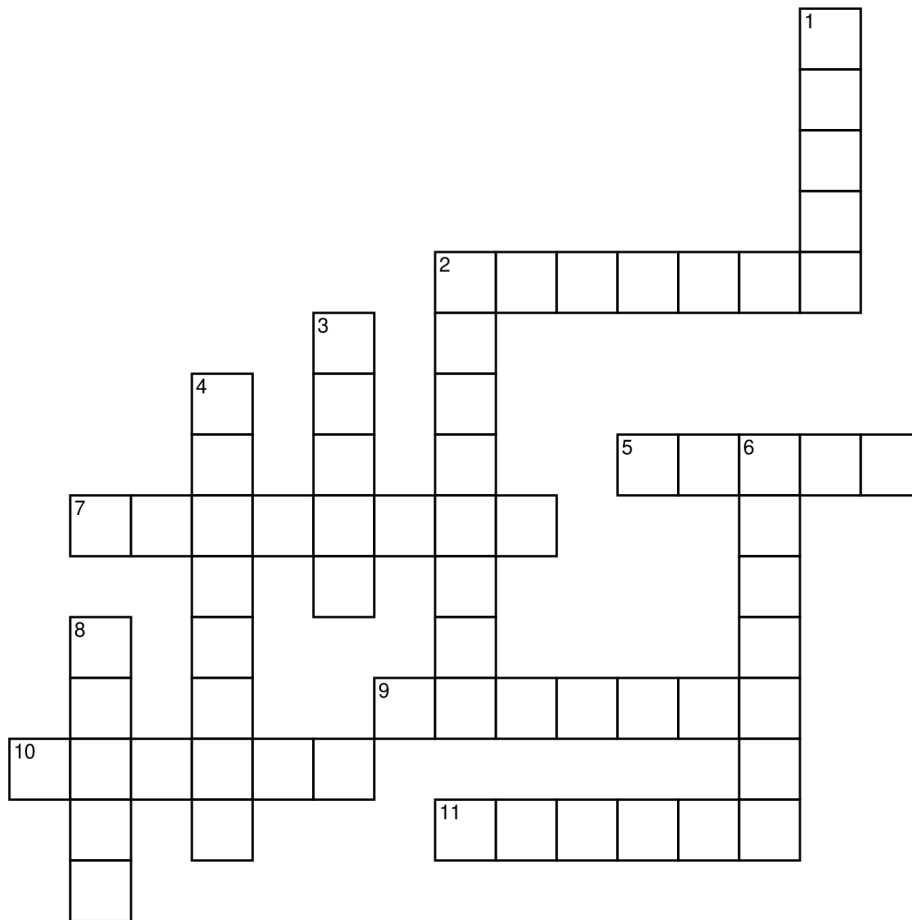
## Helpful Tip:

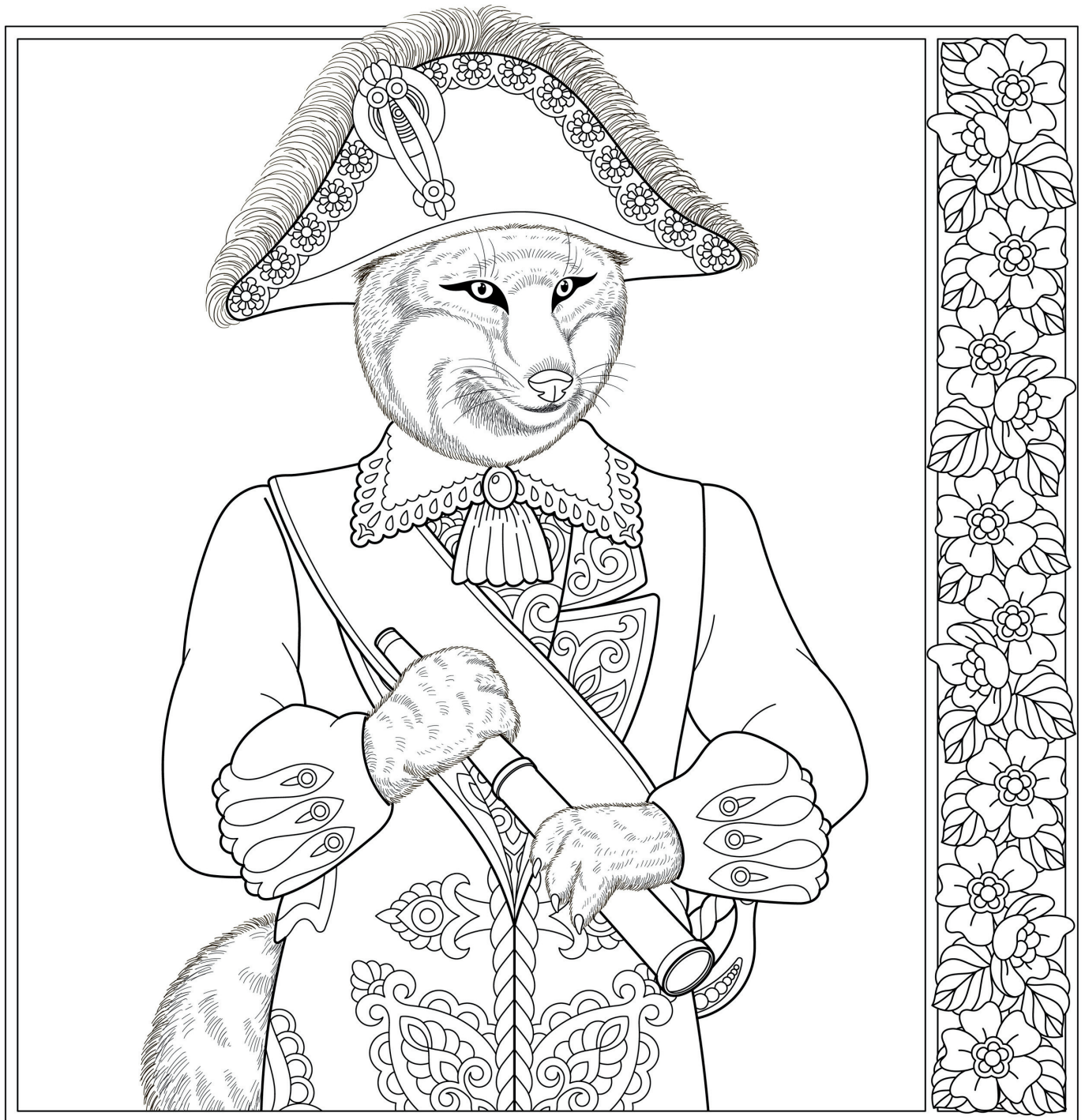

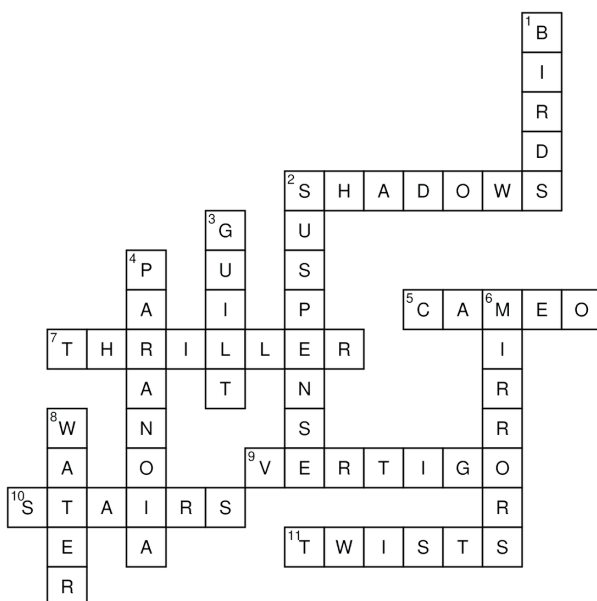
